For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to Enter themselves on Board Her Majesties Ships of

ANNE R.

Hereas it is Our Royal Intention to give all die Encouragement to all Juch Seamen and Asie-Beaiea Lindmen, who shall Voluntarily Enter themselves in Our Service, and Remain on Board Our Ships of War in Our Royal Navy, We have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Cannil, to Publish this Our Royal Proclamation; And We Out to Desirit and Durant That all fuch Seamen and Council, to Publish this Our Royal Proclamation; And We do hereby Promife and Declare, That all such Seamen, and Able-Bodical Lanamen (not above the Age of Fifty five Years, and not under the Age of Sixteen Years) who on or before the First Day of February next, shall Voluntarity Enter themselves in Our Service, either with the Officers of Our Ships of War, of the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth or Sixth Rates, or of any of Our Fire-Sizes, Bomb-Vessels or Tinders, who shall be in Sea-Pay by that time, or with any suffice of the Peace, or Vice-Admiral, to serve on Board any of Our said Skips or Vessels, shall Receive, as Our Free Gift and Royal Bounty, the respective Rewards and Allowances following, Viz.) Every such Seaman Two Months Pay, and every such Able-Bodied Landman, One Months Pay, to be paid to them respectively by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, before the respective Ships, on which they shall be, do Proceed to Sea. And We do hereby Require and Direct, That if any such Seamen, or Able-Bodied Lanaman, be. within the time before mentioned, or within Twelve Days after, Enter himfelf with any Justice of the Peace, or Vice-Admiral, to serve on Baard any of Our said Ships of War, or other Vessels before mentioned, such suffice of the Peace, or Vice-Admiral respectively, shall give to each Man so Entring a Certificate under his Hand and Seal (without Fee or Reward) of his Entry, and the time of such a Number of Days where the passes of the passes. do hereby Promise and Declare, That all such Seamen, and Certificate under his Hand and Seal (without Fee or Reward) of his Entry, and the time of Juch Entry, and for what Ship, and hall thereby limit fuch a Number of Days as may be Necessary for his Repairing on Board Juch Ship, or any other Ship, Bomb-Vessel or Tender in Our Service, at the next Port. And We do hereby Declare, Toat all Juch Seanen, and Able-Bodied Landmen, who shall, on or before the Jaid First Day of February next ensuing, Enter thinsselves, as a foresaid, and within the time limited and appointed in Juch Certificate, Repair on Board any of Our Ships or Tenders, shall be Instituted to Our Royal Boarty harders appointed. themselves, as aforesaid, and within the time limited and appointed in such Certificate, Repair on Board any of Our Ships or Tenders, shall be Intituled to Our Royal Bounty borein before appointed, according to their respective Qualifications, and not otherwise; And that they and also such who shall so Enter themselves within Twelve Days after the said First Day of February, shall be allowed Time without Molestation to render themselves on Board Our Ships of War; And therefore We do hereby Require and Command all Captains Commanding any of Our Ships of War, or other Our Ships or Vessels aforesaid, and all other Persons whatsoever, Authorized or Impowered to Impress Mariners for Our Service, That they do not Impress or Molestany such Seaman or Able-Bodied Landmen, to whouse the true Intent and Meaning of this Our Royal Preclanation, or any Men now in Our Service, who by Tickets Signed by any One of Our Flag-Officers, have or shall have Leave to be Absent from their Dury to the First Day of February next, before they shall fail to render themselves on Board such of Our Ships, Pessels or Tenders, on which they shall Enter treemselves to Serve, or to which they shall selong, according to the Time limited by such their Gertificates or Tickets. And to the end We may be truly ingurand what Persons shall so Enter and Render themselves to Serve on Board Our Fleet in parsuance of this Our Pracionalists, We do hereby Require and Command Our reclamation, We do hereby Require and Command Our reclamation.

And for Provention of any Deceits or Abuses which may happen by any Person or Persons Leaving the Ships to which they belong, and Entring him or themselves on Brand any other of Our Ships, as a sore-faid, in order to the Obtaining the Bruny-Money herein before Granted, We do hereby likewise Direct, Declare, and Command, That such Seamen and Landmen belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels whatsoever, as shall absent themselves from any of the Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall Enter themselves on Board any other of Our Ships, in order to the Obtaining the said Bounts-Money, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ship which they shall so leave, but also be severely pumpled according to their Demenis. And We do hereny surther Declare, That if such Men in Our Service, who are or shall be permitted to be Absent pessels as a sives of the time at lowed by such Tickets, they shall not only be liable to be Imbe permitted to be Abjent by Juck Tickets, as aforefair, annot repair on Boara their respective Ships by the time allowed by Juch Tickets, they shall not only be liable to be Impressed, but to Susser Juch further Pumisiment as by Law may be institled on them for Juch their Neglect. And We do hereby also sirily Charge and Command all the Castains and Officers of Our Ships, and others, who shall not be string of Men for Our Filest, that there take particular Care not to Impress or Entertain any Persons whits seven the shall not be striy Qualified to serve in Our Royal Navy. And whereas, it has been often jound, that in time of War, great Numbers of Seamen have less the usual Places of their Abode, and have removed them selves into Private and Observe Phaes, endeavouning thereby to avoid the Publick Service when there is the greatest Occasion for them, We do hereby therefore Require and Command all Our Justices of the Peace, Constables and other Officers, that they not only give all necessary Assistance to Our Officers implayed in Pressing as associating. But that they do use their using Endeavours to Discover, Securand Send to some Sea-Port Town all such Seamen as shall so Absociation for the faid First Day of February next, in order to their being put on Bearsi Our Fleet, in Ours and their Countreys Service, and that of what they shall do herein, they from time to time send an Account to the Commissioners of Our Navy.
