TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 10th February, 1950, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £220,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 13th February, 1950, to Saturday, the 18th February, 1950, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders. Treasury Chambers.

DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) ACTS, 1944 AND 1946.

In pursuance of Subsection 3 of Section 1 of the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1944 (7 & 8 Geo. 6 Ch. 44) as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6 Ch. 66) His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs publishes the following name of a person upon whom immunities and privileges have been conferred by the Diplomatic Privileges (World Health Organisation) Order in Council 1949; as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (World Health Organization and International Civil Aviation Organization) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1949, the grant of privileges and immunities taking effect from 11th February, 1949.
