## A PROCLAMATION,

Commanding all Seamen and Soldiers belonging to the Marine Regiments, and other Regiments, to Render themselves into Her Majesty's Service.

ANNE R.

**W**HEREAS it hath been Represented unto Us, That great Numbers of Our Seamen and Soldiers belonging to the Marine Regiments, serving on Board Our Ships of War, and other Our Regiments serving on Land, have Deserted Our Service in the said Regiments, We have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby Require and Command all and singular Seamen and Soldiers belonging to any of Our Marine Regiments, That they and every of them, before the First Day of March next ensuing, do Render themselves on Board some or one of Our Ships of War, in order to Serve Us on Board Our Fleet in the Marine Regiments to which they do respectively belong. For which Purpose We do hereby Require the respective Captains of Our Ships of War, to Receive and Victual them, till further Order: And that they do Transmit to the Secretary of Our most Dear Consort, Our Lord High Admiral, Accounts from time to time of the Men that shall so Render themselves, and of the Marine Regiments to which they shall belong respectively. And We do hereby further Require all other Soldiers belonging to any other of Our Regiments serving on Land in England, or beyond the Seas, That they do, before the said First Day of March next, Render themselves to any Officer of the respective Regiment to which they belong, or to Our Provost-Marshal General in London. And We are hereby Graciously pleased to Declare, That such Seamen and Soldiers belonging to Our Marine Regiments, or other Our Regiments aforesaid, who have Deserted Our Service, and shall Render themselves in manner aforesaid, before the said First Day of March, shall not be Prosecuted before a Court-Martial as by Law they may be, but shall have Our Royal Pardon for such their Desertion. And We further Declare, That all such Deserters who shall not, before the said First Day of March, Render themselves according to Our Royal Commands herein before expressed, or who shall hereafter Desert Our Service, shall be Prosecuted at a Court-Martial with the utmost Severity according to Law; And being found Guilty of Deserting, they shall be incapable of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer Death according to Law.

## A PROCLAMATION,

For Seizing and Apprehending Captain Coshart, and La Touche.

**W**HEREAS Captain Coshart, and La Touche, Subjects of the French King, now in open War with Us, were lately Taken and made Prisoners of War, and as such, were detained in Our Town of Southampton, but have made their Escape out of Prison, We have therefore thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby Require and Command all Our Loving Subjects whatsoever, to Discover, Take and Seize the said Captain Coshart, La Touche, wherever they may be found; and them to Carry on Land to be Brought before One of Our Justices of the Peace, or the Chief Magistrate of any of Our Cities, Towns, Corporate, whom We hereby Require to Commit them to the next Goal, there to remain as Prisoners of War. And We do hereby Require such Justices, or Chief Magistrate, immediately to give Notice thereof to One of Our Principal Secretaries of State. And We do hereby Promise, That whatsoever shall so Discover and Apprehend the said Captain Coshart, and La Touche, or either of them, shall Have and Receive as a Reward for each of the said Persons so Apprehended, the Sum of Two Hundred Pounds. And We do hereby Authorize and Require Our Lord High Treasurer of England to make Payment thereof accordingly. And We do hereby Publish and Declare that if any Person or Persons whatsoeuer, after this Our Royal Proclamation, shall Directly or Indirectly Harbour, Retain, Keep, Succour, or Maintain the said Captain Coshart, and La Touche, or either of them, or shall Aid or Assist them in any manner, whereby they, or either of them, may avoid being Taken or Arrested, such Person or Persons shall be Prosecuted with the utmost Severity of Law, as Treasons, for Adhering to Our Enemies. And We do hereby Declare, That if any Person or Persons, other than Thomas Jackson the Mer-

chant of the Prisoners of War at Southampton, who have been, or shall be any way Aiding or Assisting to the said Captain Coshart, and La Touche, or either of them, before Notice of this Our Royal Proclamation, shall Seize and Retake them, or either of them, so that he or they be brought before some Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate, as aforesaid, such Person or Persons shall not only have Our Gracious Pardon for such Offence, but shall Have and Receive the Reward hereby Promised, as aforesaid.
