

had been joined by 2000 Men of the Troops of Flanders, commanded by the Hereditary Prince of Barenf, and was advanced within a League of the Enemy.

Cologne, February 13. We already begin to find the good Consequences of the taking of Kufenberg, seeing it has wholly freed the Navigation of the Rhine thence downwards, which was only interrupted by that Garrison. The French are to evacuate it to-morrow, and are allowed to carry with them 2 Pieces of Cannon, 2 Mortars, 2 covered, and 6 open Wagons, and to be conducted to Holland. A great quantity of Ammunition has lately been laid up at our Arsenals. The Supply of Soda is gone from hence to Münster. The Count de la Gendre, the Emperor's Envoy, has left that Place, and is gone back to Lübeck. Letters from Krefeld give the Account. That the Elector of Brandenburg's Minister there has communicated the News, that his Master had received him at Newbourg on the Danube, but that he had no other End in this and in his other Proceedings, which are taken notice of in the Circumstances of the Iniquity communicated to him, than to serve his own Interest. The States of the Circle of Saxe-Coburg have returned Answer to the Letter he lately sent to them, that his extraordinary Preparations were the occasion of their making Provision for the safety of Troops, and other Warlike Preparations for the safety of their Circle, and of the whole Empire in general, from whose Interest they are removed to no Depart.

Hamburg, February 13. Letters from Würzburg, the Affairs of that Country become daily more confused: That the Cardinal Primate has issued a second Summons for the Neodity and Senators to repair thither, in order to be present at the Meeting of the Senate on the 16th instant; But the King of Poland has Published a Proclamation, forbidding them to comply with a third Summons, and setting forth, That he looks upon the Cardinal Primate to have been forced by the Swedes to proceed in a manner, to contrary to the Constitution of that Government, it being the sole Prerogative of the Regal Authority to appoint such Meetings, by virtue whereof he has directed that a General Diet be held before him on the 16th of March; but the Place is not yet named. In the mean time the City of Würzburg being surrounded by the Swedes, it is not likely that many of the Senators will repair thither, since in the present Circumstances they cannot expect the freedom of Debate there. The Cardinal has made some Proposals for accommodating Matters, but they were rejected by the House of Lords, which continues to adhere to the Swedish Party, and the Cardinal himself is not free from suspicion of being in the same Interest. The Swedes are separately endeavoring to engage the several Parties in their Party: and it is said they have prevailed with the Family of Pernitz, and have hopes of gaining several others in Saxony. They write from Prussia. That the King of Poland was come from Dantzick to Marienwerder, and was expected in few days at Elbing, and that they are putting the principal Places of that Country into a posture of Defence, to prevent their falling into the hands of the Swedish Forces, which continues to march that way. These Letters add, That a considerable Army of Magdeburg is come into Lübeck, with Orders to treat very kindly all those who join with them. But to Jeffrey the Elizars of all that do not declare for them. The Accounts which we lately received of the Ranges committed by that Nation in the neighbourhood of Narva, are confirmed by other fresh Accounts from that City: and they add, that General Forces were sent out from Thessaloniki to observe their Movements, and prevent a sudden Surprise.

Prague, February 13. The French King has made the Marshal d'Albigny Captain of his Life-Guards. In the name of the Marshal de Lorges, demanded. They write from Amsterdam, that the Duke's Vice-Chancery there has caused in the Gates of that Town to be put up, except two, a Table of the necessary Precautions for the Security of their Cities, bearing at the Headments in one Sentence, that grow daily more numerous, the old account corresponding to Letters from Strasbourg of the last

Year, say, the Regiments of Champaign, Noyon, the Queen's, and St. Scolaris, were marched from thence towards the Upper Alsatian, and that the Marshal de Villeroy would shortly be going thither, but his Design is not yet known.

Hague, February 13. N. S. All the United Provinces in general, have now given their Consent to the Publication of an Treaty and Correspondence by Letters with France and Spain for one Year, and there remain only some Inland Matters to be settled in relation thereto, which will suffice adjusted. The Deputies of the several Colleges of the Assembly have lately had several Conferences with those of the States General, concerning the Preparations at sea for the next Campaign. Major General Recadier, who was lately sent hither by the Elector of Palatinate to confer with the Deputies of the States General, is returned to Dillfeldorp.

Göteborg, Feb. 13. Yesterday a Flushing Caper brought in here a Proclamation of the St. Peter of Dantzick, laden with Wine from Burgoz.

St. James's, February 8. Monsieur Restaurois Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, had this day publick Audience of Her Majesty, to which he was conducted in Her Majesty's Coach, by Sir Charles Goring Master of the Ceremonies, in the usual manner.

After which he had publick Audience of His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, being likewise introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.

Wharves the Ships St. Joffre &c of Dantzick, and Trans-Saint-Jean, and the rest of Her Majestys Ships the Medway, have been Confiscated and Sold to Sweden, and the New Provisions of Arms and other Cargo's being now required by the Contraband of the Provinces, as also by the Admiralty of the Prussian, German, Hanoverian, &c Fleets, by which it appears how much is lost in the Capture.

The Revenue Officer for Prussia sent a warning notice, That on Tuesday the 16th instant, at his Office for Payment of Customs in the Little Prussian, Castle Garden, or Wall street, in Dantzick, he paid to the said Customs Officer Declaration for Publishing, the just Proportion due to each of them, according to the Directions in Her Majestys most Gracious Declaration for the Encouragement of Merchants of War, &c.
