THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (CONTROL OF ADVERTISEMENTS) REGULATIONS, 1948.

THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (CONTROL OF ADVERTISEMENTS) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1949.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council for the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight in exercise of their powers under Regulation 10 of the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations, 1948, have submitted for the approval of the Minister of Town and Country Planning an order defining as areas of special control for the purposes of the said Regulations areas of land situate in the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight and forming parts of the Boroughs of Newport and Ryde, the Urban Districts of Cowes, Sandown-Shanklin and Ventnor and the Rural District of the Isle of Wight and described in the Schedule hereto, which land is shown edged red and left uncoloured on the map accompanying the order, and that the order is about to be considered by the Minister.

A copy of the order, of the map referred to (and also maps to the scale of 6 in. to one mile showing in detail the parts of each county district affected) and a statement of reasons submitted therewith have been deposited at the following offices and will be open for inspection without payment of fee between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays inclusive and 9.30 a.m. and 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays:—

The whole of the Borough of Newport *except* those portions hatched blue on the plan accompanying the Order.

In the Borough of Ryde, I.W.

The whole of the Borough of Ryde *except* those portions hatched green on the plan accompanying the Order.

In the Urban District of Cowes, I.W.

The whole of the Urban District of Cowes *except* those portions hatched brown on the plan accompanying the Order.

In the Urban District of Sandown-Shanklin, I.W.

The whole of the Urban District of Sandown-Shanklin *except* those portions hatched orange on the plan accompanying the Order.

In the Urban District of Ventnor, I.W.

The whole of the Urban District of Ventnor *except* those portions hatched yellow on the plan accompanying the Order.

In the Rural District of the I.W.

The whole of the Parishes of Bembridge, Brading, Brighthorne, Calbourne, Chale, Gatcombe, Godshill, Newchurch, Niton, Shalfeet, Shorwell, South Arreton, Totland and Yarmouth and the whole of the Parish of Freshwater *except* those portions hatched purple on the plan accompanying the Order.
