JE daily receive very difinal Accounts of the Damage done by the Earthquake which happened on the 14th of the last Month. It was so violent at Cassa, that it is said a Mountain near that Place was rent it is laid a Mountain near that Place was rent afunder, and the greatest part of the Town is ruined: The Towns of Norcia, Spoleti, Castel-Vecchio, Aquila, and many other Places, have also received great Damage, and the number of those who have been killed by the fall of the Houses and other Buildings is computed to be much greater than was at first reported. Venice, February 9.
