WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of May, 1950 (P.M.2820/50), in the words following, viz.:-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of Services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date 28th day of February, 1941, sanction was given to the promotion of Instructor Captain Arthur Edward Hall, C.B., C.B.E., A.R.C.S., R.N., to the rank of Instructor Rear Admiral and, *inter alia*, for the rate of his retired pay to be £814 10s. 0d. a year:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date 28th day of July, 1949, sanction was given to the introduction of revised service retired pay and pension regulations:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the said Instructor Rear Admiral Sir Arthur Edward Hall, K.B.E., C.B., A.R.C.S., should receive a rate of retired pay appropriate to his rank and service of his retired pay to be £814, 10s. 0d. a year: under those regulations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of retired pay at the rate of £1,100 a year:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lord Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date of 1st February, 1926, the conditions of service of Officers of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service were laid down:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date of 30th April, 1936, it was provided that Senior Chief Officers of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service after three years' seniority as such, should rank with but after Lieutenants, R.N. which by Order in Council bearing date of 25th April, 1950, was amended to seven years' seniority so as to bring them into line with Commissioned Officers (Branch List) having comparable qualifications:

"And whereas we desire to accord to the officer of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service serving as Officer in Charge of the Whitehall W/T Station, Admiralty, the rank appropriate to the responsibilities of the post:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction with effect from 1st April, 1949, the introduction of the rank of Lieutenant (Shore Wireless Service). The officer serving in the post specified would be required to attain five years' seniority as a Senior Chief Officer (Shore Wireless Service) before being granted the rank of Lieutenant (Shore Wireless Service) substantively. The rates of pay and retired pay for the rank to be the same as those of a Lieutenant (Branch List), Royal Navy;

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."
