Vienna, Febr. 24. A Courier arrived here yesterday from Count Schlick, who commands the Imperial Forces in Upper Austria, with Advice, That he was returned to his head Quarter near Lintx from Salesbourg, where he had been to dispose the Bishop of that Place to give what Assistance he could in the Expedition against the Elector of Bavaria; that he had been joined by the Regiment of Cuirassiers of Hanover, and two Saxon Regiments, and that the rest of the Saxon Forces were coming up with all possible diligence. He had possed his Regiment of Dragoons and two Troops of Hustiars at Bajerbath and Ridan, within half a mile of the Confines of Bavaria, and 10 Battalions of Imperial Foot lay cantoned in a Line behind them; and it is hoped that next week he will enter upon Action. The French have lad a Design of entring iato the Country of Tirol by the way of the Valteline; but Lieutenant-General Barbezieres, who was to have the Direction of this Enterprise, was seized in that Country, disguised in a Peazant's Habit, and is now a Prisoner at Bragenz, near the Lake of Constance.
