NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PRELIMINARY DRAFT OF  
REGULATIONS ENTITLED THE NATIONAL INSURANCE  
(CLAIMS AND PAYMENTS) AMENDMENT (NO. 2)  
REGULATIONS, 1950.

In accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Claims and Payments) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations, 1950.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

The Committee will take into consideration any objections, made by or on behalf of persons affected, sent to them before 18th July, 1950. Having regard to the terms of the Act, which provides that objections must be made within a period of 28 days at most, the Committee are unable to allow a longer period within which objections may be submitted. If an objection is submitted within the prescribed time, however, the Committee will be prepared, if they are satisfied that sufficient grounds exist, to allow the later submission of evidence or explanation in support of the objection. EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These regulations amend the National Insurance (Claims and Payments) Regulations, 1948, so that any failure, by a person who has not previously claimed sickness benefit, to give notice of incapacity shall not thereby result in his being disqualified for the receipt of that benefit; and by extending the time for making a claim for sickness benefit by a person who claims for the first time. They also amend the provisions for extending the time for giving notice of incapacity; and they relax, in favour of certain persons who are or have been in hospital, the provisions relating to the proof of good cause for delay in giving such notice or claiming sickness benefit. The remaining amendments are of a minor or consequential character.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT ACT, 1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made "The London Traffic (Prohibition of Waiting) (Har.cw) Regulations, 1950" (S.I. 1950 No. 979), coming into operation on the 6th July, 1950, which prohibit, with certain exceptions, any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in that length of High Street, Harlow (Route B.183), which extends from its junction with the London—Norwich Trunk Road (Route A.11) eastwards for a distance of 170 yards.
