Reme, Febr. 17. We have not had any Returns of the late Earthquake fince that of the 2d Initant, which has done fo much Damage to feveral Palaces and other Buildings of this City, and io much weakened them, that another shock would overturn tham. Paris, March 5. The Court returned the 24th paft from Marli to Verfailles; The 27th Signior Almino Pifani, Ambaffador from the Republick of Venice, had Audence of Leave, and he is preparing for his departure home. The 28th the Marshal of Harcourt took his Post as Captain of the French King's Libe-Guards. The Sieur de Chatesuneut, who has refided at the Ottoman Porte in the Chality of Ambaffador from this Crown, is appointed to go with the faine Character to the Court of Portugal, in the room of the Prelident Roulle, who is recalled. The Marshal de Boufflers came to this Court the 27th palf from Brullis, to give the King an Account of the Potture of Affairs in the Spanish Netherlands, and to receive further Instructions. On the first Instant he waited upon the King to a Review of the French Regiment of Foot-Guards, whereas this Marshal is Colonel: To morrow there is to be another Review of the French and Swifs Guards, and then a Draught will be made out of them to ferve in Flanders and Germany this Summer, who will begin their March on the 10th Instant. The other Troops of the King's Housshold will be reviewed on the 12th, and the Detachments of these Troops which are to make the Campaign will begin to march the 14th. Our forces in Germany have taken the Field so soon, that the Orficers, especially those of the Cavalry, had not time to recruit their Regiments, and to provide themselves with Neceliaries; so that they are likely to suffer very much. Letters from Strasbourg say, our Forces before Kehl have carried forward their Approaches within 50 Paces of the Hornwork; yet several Officers, who have a periest knowledge of that Place, are of Opinion that it will not be taken so easily as is generally believed here: Monsieur Lapara is going to that Siege, to serve as achief Engliser.
