

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under Section 49 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, authorising the stopping up of a bridleway at New Bilton, Rugby, in the County of Warwick, and requiring the provision of a new bridleway repairable by the inhabitants at large, for which the highway authority is to be the Council of the Borough of Rugby.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

River Nene Catchment Board.

Hundred of Wisbech Internal Drainage District.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Section 4 (3) of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, proposes to make an Order confirming, with a modification, a scheme submitted to him by the River Nene Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the following matters:—

(1) The constitution of an Internal Drainage District to be known as the Hundred of Wisbech Internal Drainage District.

(2) The constitution of an Internal Drainage Board for the said Internal Drainage District.

(3) The abrogation of the powers of the Commissioners of Sewers for the Hundred of Wisbech and Parts Adjacent over that part of their area to be included in the aforesaid new district.

(4) Certain matters supplemental to or consequential on the matters aforesaid.

A copy of the draft Order has been deposited, together with a copy of the Scheme, as amended, and of the map referred to therein, at the offices of the Acting Clerk to the Commissioners of Sewers for the Hundred of Wisbech and Parts Adjacent, at 13, South Brink, Wisbech, and also at the offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Someries House, St. Andrew's Place, Regent's Park, London, N.W.1, for public inspection for a period of thirty-one days from the date of this notice and may be inspected during the ordinary hours of business.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1937.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1950, No. 997.

The Sheep Scab (Berwyn Mountains) Order, 1950.

(Made 14th June, 1950.)

This Order makes it illegal to move sheep out of a specified area in the Berwyn Mountains on and after 15th July, 1950, unless their movement has been authorised by a licence of the Local Authority. In order to qualify for the licence to move out of the area sheep must, unless they are intended for immediate slaughter, have been dipped in an approved "Single-Dipping" type sheep dip or double-dipped in an approved sheep dip within the previous 56 days.

This Order also requires that, with certain exceptions, all sheep in the specified area shall be dipped in an approved "Single-Dipping" type sheep dip or double-dipped in an approved sheep dip between 15th July and 31st August and again between 4th September and 31st October, 1950.

The Sheep Scab (Cumberland Dipping Area)

Order, 1950. (Made 14th June, 1950.)

This Order requires that, with certain exceptions, all sheep in Cumberland shall be dipped in an approved "Single-Dipping" type sheep dip between 11th August and 31st August, between 11th October and 31st October and again between 11th December and 31st December, 1950.

EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.

County Borough of West Ham.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Town and Country Planning, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has prepared in draft and proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over Barnby Place and part of Barnby Street, West Ham.

A copy of the draft Order and of a map showing the land over which the rights of way proposed to be extinguished subsist may be inspected at the Town Clerk's Department (General Office), West Ham Town Hall, Stratford, E.15, without payment of fee, during the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.

Any objection to this proposal must be made in writing and addressed to the Minister of Town and Country Planning, 32 St. James's Square, London, S.W.1, before the 23rd day of September, 1950.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to cause a local inquiry to be held. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.
