For Calling Out the Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of March, 1924, it is provided that the Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers of the Royal Navy, shall be called out for actual service in a time of war or emergency by Royal Proclamation directing the said Officers to hold themselves in readiness for actual service, and authorising the Admiralty to employ all or any of the Officers so called out as they may think fit:

And Whereas a case of emergency has arisen:

We do hereby order and direct that Officers of the Retired and Emergency Lists of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines do hold themselves in readiness for actual service, and do hereby authorise the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to employ all or any of the said Officers as they think fit.

A PROCLAMATION

For Extending the Services of Time-Expired Men in the Royal Navy

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by the ninth section of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the 16th and 17th years of the Reign of Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to make better provision concerning the entry and service of seamen, and otherwise to amend the laws concerning Her Majesty's Navy", it is enacted that in case We shall by Proclamation call upon the seamen, or any class or classes serving in Our Navy, or such of them as may be required so to do, to extend the term of their services, any seaman to whom such Proclamation shall extend, and whose term of service shall have expired at the date of such Proclamation, or may expire while such Proclamation shall continue in force, may be required to serve for such further period as is mentioned in the said section from the expiration of such term, if his services be so long required, and shall be liable to serve accordingly:

And Whereas We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, deem it expedient to extend the service of all classes of men now serving in Our Navy whose term of service may have expired, or may expire while this Proclamation shall continue in force:

We, by and with the advice aforesaid, do hereby call upon all classes of men now serving in Our Navy whose terms of service may have expired, or may expire while this Proclamation shall continue in force, to extend their respective terms of service as may be required under the said section.

A PROCLAMATION

For Extending the Services of Time-Expired Men in the Royal Marine Forces

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by the Royal Marines Act, 1939, We may by proclamation call upon marines serving in the Royal Marine Forces to extend the term of their services for such period as is mentioned in the said Act:

And Whereas We deem it expedient that the power vested in Us by the said Act should be exercised as is hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby call upon all marines now serving in the Royal Marine Forces to extend the term of their service for such period as is mentioned in the said Act.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and in the Fourteenth year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of the Royal Naval Reserve (Volunteer) Act, 1859, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, on such occasions as He shall deem fit (the occasion being first communicated to Parliament, if Parliament be sitting, or declared in Council and notified by

Proclamation, if Parliament be not sitting or in being) to order and direct that the volunteers under that Act, or so many or such part of them as He may deem necessary, shall be called into actual service:

And whereas by the Royal Naval Reserve Volunteer Act, 1896, as amended by the Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1902, it is enacted that the power under the said Act of 1859 to raise and pay volunteers may be exercised outside the British Islands in respect of British subjects:

And whereas by the Naval Reserve Act, 1900, the Admiralty are authorised to raise and keep up a new division, commonly known as the Royal Fleet Reserve, of the force raised under the said first recited Act in addition to the men raised under that Act, and such new division is liable to be called out as part of the Royal Naval Reserve under the said fourth section of the said Act of 1859:

And whereas by the first section of the Naval Reserve (Mobilisation) Act, 1900, amending the said Act of 1859, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, where He orders and directs that volunteers under that Act shall be called into actual service, to authorise the Admiralty to give and, when given, to revoke or vary, such directions as may seem

necessary or proper for calling out all or any of the said volunteers as the occasion may require:

And whereas Parliament has been informed that owing to the state of public affairs, and the demands upon the Naval Forces, an occasion has arisen for ordering and directing the Royal Fleet Reserve to be called into actual service:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and direct that the said volunteers be called into actual service.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are hereby authorised to give, and when given, to revoke or vary, such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out all or any of the said volunteers as the occasion may require.

Nothing herein contained shall be construed as in any way affecting the liability of any person to be recalled, or to be required to re-enter, into actual service in pursuance of the provisions of the Naval and Marine Forces (Temporary Release from Service) Act, 1940, or the Naval Forces (Extension of Service) Act, 1944.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section 1 of the Census Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5. c. 41) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1920"), that, subject to the provisions of that Act, His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time direct that a Census shall be taken for Great Britain, and any Order so made may prescribe the date of such Census, the persons by whom and in respect to whom the returns for the purpose of such Census are to be made and the particulars to be stated in the returns:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Census Order, 1950.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) In this Order "prescribed" means prescribed by regulations made under the Act of 1920.

2. A Census shall be taken for Great Britain on the 8th day of April, 1951, in respect of—

(a) all persons in Great Britain; and

(b) all other persons (being persons normally resident in Great Britain) mentioned in paragraph 5 of the first column of the first schedule to this Order;

who are alive at midnight ending that day.

3. The returns for the purpose of the Census shall be made with respect to the classes of persons mentioned in the first column of the first schedule to this Order by the persons mentioned opposite each such class in the second column of that schedule:

Provided that any person claiming in the prescribed manner to make a confidential return shall, subject to the prescribed conditions, be deemed to be the person by whom the return is to be made with respect to himself.

4. The returns shall state—

(a) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made, the particulars specified in part I of the second schedule to this Order;

(b) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made in Scotland, the additional particulars specified in part II of that schedule; and

(c) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made in Wales (including Monmouth), the additional particulars specified in part III of that schedule.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Persons with respect to whom returns are to be made

1. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day in a dwelling, lodgings or rooms, separately occupied by any private household of which they are members, guests (including paying guests or boarders), or employees.

2. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of any hotel, club, boarding-house, or common or other lodging-house.

3. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of

(a) any hospital within the meaning of section 79 of the National Health Service Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6. c. 81), or section 80 of the National Health Service (Scotland) Act, 1947 (10 & 11 Geo. 6. c. 27);

(b) any certified house or approved home within the meaning of section 71 of the Mental Deficiency Act, 1913 (3 & 4 Geo. 5. c. 28), or any certified house within the meaning of section 39 of the Mental Deficiency and Lunacy (Scotland) Act, 1913 (3 & 4 Geo. 5. c. 38);

(c) any nursing home, religious or charitable community, residential school or college; or

(d) any residential institution whatsoever not being an institution mentioned elsewhere in this schedule.

Persons by whom returns are to be made

1. The head, or person for the time being acting as the head, of the household.

2. The manager or other person for the time being in charge of the premises.

3. The chief resident officer or other person for the time being in charge of the hospital, house home, community, school, college or institution.

4. Persons belonging to the naval, military, or air forces of the Crown, and any other persons, present at midnight ending the Census day on any vessel or in any barracks, station, or other premises under naval, military, or air force discipline or on any premises in respect of which the Registrar General is satisfied that on grounds of security special arrangements ought to be made.

5. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day
- (a) on any ship, boat, barge, or other vessel in any inland waters or engaged in any coast-wise or fishing voyage, or lying moored or anchored in any place; or
 - (b) on any British ship voyaging between Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands if those persons are normally resident in Great Britain.

6. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of a remand home or approved school.

7. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of any civil prison, lock-up or other place of detention.

8. Persons who, not having been enumerated elsewhere for the purpose of the Census, arrive at any of the places or premises above mentioned after midnight ending the Census day and before the returns in respect of persons present on or in such premises or places are required to be delivered up.

9. Persons not included among any of the classes of persons above mentioned.

4. The officer or other person appointed for the purpose in pursuance of arrangements made by the Admiralty, Army Council, Air Council or the Department concerned.

5. The captain, master, or other person for the time being in charge of the vessel.

6. The chief resident officer or other person for the time being in charge of the home or school.

7. The governor or other person for the time being in charge of the premises.

8. The persons specified above as the person by whom the returns are to be made with respect to the persons present at midnight ending the Census day on or in any of the premises or places above mentioned.

9. The person with respect to whom the return is to be made.

1. Full name.

5. (a) In respect of each person aged 16 years or over, whether single, married, widowed or divorced.

 - (i) the month and year of her present marriage;
 - (ii) whether married more than once;
 - (iii) If married more than once, the month and year of her first marriage.
6. Children born in marriage to each married woman under the age of 50—
 - (a) the number of such children; and
 - (b) whether she has given birth to such a child since 9th April, 1950.
7. Usual residence.
8. Place of birth, stating—
 - (a) if born in the United Kingdom, the name of the county and town or parish;
 - (b) if born outside the United Kingdom, the name of the country and the state, province or district or whether born at sea.
9. If born outside the United Kingdom and—
 - (a) of British nationality, stating whether British by birth or descent, by naturalisation, through marriage or otherwise;
 - (b) not of British nationality, stating nationality.
10. In respect of persons aged 15 years or over,—
 - (a) profession, trade, manufacture, service or other occupation, stating precise branch, and if occupied in trade or manufacture stating the particular kind of work done, of material worked in and of article, if any, made or dealt in;
 - (b) (i) whether out of work, retired, apprentice or artied pupil, employed part time or helping unpaid in a business carried on by the head of family or other relative;
 - (ii) if ordinarily occupied as employee, stating name and business of present employer, or if out of work or retired, of last employer;
 - (iii) whether ordinarily occupied as employer, stating nature of business conducted, or whether ordinarily occupied neither as employer nor employee;
 - (c) if not retired, stating the address of the place of work, or whether working at no regular place of work or whether the work is carried on mainly at home.
11. (a) Whether occupied in (i) full time or (ii) part time attendance at an educational establishment.
(b) In respect of every person following or seeking to follow an occupation for payment or profit, and who is not retired, the age at which full time education in an educational establishment finally ceased.
12. (a) Number of living rooms dwelt in by the persons in respect of whom particulars are included in the return.
(b) In respect of such persons, whether the household has exclusive or shared use of a piped water supply within the house, a kitchen sink, a cooking stove or range, a watercloset and a fixed bath.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of April, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 and 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the consecrated church of Saint James, East Allington, in the parish of West Allington with East Allington in the county and diocese of Lincoln.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas the said Church of Saint James, East Allington, is a Chapel of Ease to the parish church of the said parish of West Allington with East Allington:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint James, East Allington has ceased to be used for the purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the marriage registers current at the said church of Saint James, East Allington, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of the parish of West Allington with East Allington.

"2. That so soon as conveniently may be after the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the Church of Saint James, East Allington, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold or disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times, and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"3. That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Lincoln established pursuant to the said Measures.

"4. That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint James, East Allington, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to some other church or churches within the said Diocese of Lincoln and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint James, East Allington, or such of them as the Bishop of Lincoln shall select, shall also be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the Diocese of Lincoln as the bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint James, East Allington as aforesaid."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

GENERAL SERVICE CLASS AND LINKED DEPARTMENTAL VARIANTS RECRUITMENT TO BASIC GRADES UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS.

1. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these regulations except that women will not be eligible for appointments under the Admiralty, the Air Ministry, or the Post Office.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

2. Age.

(i) for General Service Class posts and for the Ministry of Fuel and Power Departmental posts.

Candidates must be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on 30 November, 1950, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1 December, 1915, and on or before 30 November, 1925.

(ii) for the Post Office Departmental posts.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 35 years of age on 30 November, 1950, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1 December, 1915, and on or before 30 November, 1929.

(iii) for the Ministry of Civil Aviation and the Ministry of Supply Departmental posts.

Candidates must be at least 23 and under 35 years of age on 30 November, 1950, i.e., they must have been born on or after 1 December, 1915, and on or before 30 November, 1927.

But for all posts

(1) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(2) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 30th November, 1950.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, Air Ministry, or Ministry of Supply unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for Air or Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

4. Qualifications.

A CANDIDATE WHO IS TAKING THE NECESSARY EXAMINATION FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS BELOW BEFORE 30 NOVEMBER, 1950, WILL BE ADMITTED TO THE COMPETITION BEFORE THE RESULT OF HIS EXAMINATION IS KNOWN. HE WILL NOT, HOWEVER, BE DECLARED SUCCESSFUL UNLESS ON THE RESULT OF THE EXAMINATION HE OBTAINS THE REQUISITE QUALIFICATION.

(A) GENERAL SERVICE CLASS POSTS.

(i) The minimum qualifications must include either

(a) Corporate Membership of the Institution of Civil Engineers, or the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, or the Institution of Electrical Engineers; or

(b) A University Engineering degree, or other examination passes required by any of the above institutions for exemption from Sections A and B of their examination for Associate Membership; but candidates admitted under this sub-section must obtain the qualification in sub-section (a) above before they are confirmed in their appointment. EXCEPTIONALLY, however, where a candidate is prevented, by circumstances outside his control, from obtaining the further qualification, appointment may be confirmed with the concurrence of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners; *provided that*

(c) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, admit candidates who can furnish evidence of exceptionally high professional attainment.

(ii) In addition candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualifications (see Regulation 4A (i) (a) and (b) on this page) and their practical experience are appropriate to the particular requirements specified below.

Admiralty.

Candidates for the Admiralty Production Pool must have not less than three years' experience of production in mechanical and/or electrical engineering industry after full indentured apprenticeship or after graduation and general practical training.

For Mechanical Engineer posts in the Civil Engineer-in-Chief's Department, the minimum qualifications mentioned in Regulation 4A (i) on this page relate to the Institution of Mechanical Engineers only, and in addition candidates must have been employed for a minimum of two years with a well-established engineering concern of sufficient size and scope for them to have gained experience in both mechanical and electrical engineering after full indentured apprenticeship or after graduation and general practical training.

Ministry of Transport.

Candidates for mechanical posts must have completed a recognised course of theoretical and technical training in mechanical and automobile engineering and have experience of road vehicle design and construction. For electrical posts candidates must be experienced in the preparation of specifications and in investigating the performance of equipment. In addition a knowledge of testing in relation to electrical work is required.

Ministry of Works.

Candidates will be required to furnish evidence of their apprenticeship and subsequent experience which should have afforded a good general training in mechanical or electrical engineering, capable of subsequent development to cover a wide field of responsibility.

Some experience in one or more of the following branches will be essential:—

Design and execution of engineering installations for office buildings, factories or hospitals, including heating, ventilation, air conditioning, electric wiring, illumination and lifts.

Design and installation of mechanical plant such as steam boilers, pressure vessels, pumps, water treatment, refrigeration, chemical processes, air compressors and air, hydraulic or steam pipelines, I.C. engines.

Design and installation of electrical plant such as transformers, switchgear, H.T. and L.T. overhead and underground distribution, D.C. and A.C. motors and generators and rectifiers.

Management of operation and maintenance of engineering plant in large office buildings, factories or institutions.

Air Ministry.

Candidates must:—

I. (a) be holders of a University degree in electrical and/or mechanical engineering, and have served at least two years' apprenticeship; or

(b) be graduates of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or hold an equivalent diploma in electrical engineering, and have served at least three years' apprenticeship; or

(c) be graduates of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, or hold an equivalent diploma in mechanical engineering with appreciable electrical engineering experience and have served at least a three-year apprenticeship.

II. Have been employed for a minimum of two years with a well-established engineering concern of sufficient size and scope for them to have gained experience in both mechanical and electrical engineering.

(B) THE DEPARTMENTAL VARIANTS.

(a) Ministry of Civil Aviation.

Candidates must:—

(i) be Corporate Members of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or be Associate Fellows of the Royal Aeronautical Society; or

(ii) have passed Sections A and B of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or hold an educational qualification recognised by that Institution as giving exemption from examination in those Sections; but candidates admitted under this sub-section must normally obtain the qualification in sub-section (i) above before they are confirmed in their appointment (Exception may be made in special circumstances provided for in Regulation 4A (i) (b) on page 6); or

(iii) hold a first or second class Honours degree in Physics or Engineering *provided that* the Commissioners may at their discretion admit, exceptionally, candidates who furnish evidence of high professional attainment.

In addition all candidates must produce evidence that both the examination subjects included in their qualifications and their practical experience justify their employment on civil aviation telecommunications duties.

(b) Ministry of Fuel and Power.

Candidates for Assistant Fuel Engineer posts must:—

(i) have obtained Corporate Membership of the Institute of Fuel by examination, or of the Institution of Mechanical or Chemical Engineers or

(ii) have a University Engineering degree or other examination passes required by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers or the Institute of Fuel for exemption from Sections A and B of their examinations for Associate Membership or

(iii) be Graduate Members of the Institution of Chemical Engineers.

Candidates admitted under sub-sections (ii) or (iii) above must normally obtain the corresponding qualification in sub-section (i) above before they are confirmed in their appointment. (Exception may be made in special circumstances as in Regulation 4A (i) on page 6.)

Candidates should also have industrial experience in the use of fuel and power and practical knowledge in one or more of the following subjects:—

(i) the transmission and use of steam for power, and process of heating purposes;

(ii) the combustion and properties of British coals and other fuels;

(iii) producer gas practice and its application to metallurgical furnaces;

(iv) the design and operation of boilers, furnaces and ancillary equipment;

(v) heating and ventilation practice and the domestic uses of fuel.

Candidates for the Electricity meter examiner post must:—

(a) have obtained Corporate Membership of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, or

(b) have a University degree in Electrical Engineering or other examination passes required by the Institution of Electrical Engineers for exemption from Sections A and B of their Examination for Associate Membership, but candidates admitted under this sub-section must normally obtain the qualification in sub-section (a) above before they are confirmed in their appointment. (Exception may be made in special circumstances as in Regulation 4A (i) on page 6.)

Candidates must also have:—

(a) not less than three years' experience in precision electrical measurements and the testing of all types of electricity supply meter, and

(b) at least a three-year apprenticeship or pupilage with an electrical engineering firm of repute or in the Electricity Supply Industry, or, in place of (b)

(c) after graduation at a University, general practical training or pupilage with an electrical engineering firm of repute or in the Electricity Supply Industry.

(c) Post Office.

Candidates must normally possess an Honours degree in Mechanical or Electrical Engineering or in Physics, but exceptionally the Commissioners may accept any other candidate qualified under Regulation 4A (i) on page 6.

(d) Ministry of Supply.

The paper qualifications required are the same as for the General Service competition (see Regulation 4A (i) (a) (b) and (c) on page 6), except that Associate Fellowship of the Royal Aeronautical Society will be accepted as an alternative to Corporate Membership of one of the Institutions named in Regulation 4A (i) (a), and, similarly equivalent qualification to Sections A and B of the Society's examination for Associate Fellowship will be accepted as an alternative to the qualifications in Regulation 4A (i) (b). In addition, candidates must have received a full and proper training as an engineer and will be required to state on their application forms the nature of any particular engineering experience they have gained. Training must include an engineering apprenticeship or pupilage including a minimum period of two years in the workshops of an establishment of good standing.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Application.

Only one application may be made under these Regulations. Application must be made on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

7. Competition.

Those candidates who on the evidence of their Application Forms, and any further information which the Commissioners think necessary to obtain, are found to be *prima facie* eligible, will be summoned to a Selection Board. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, summon only those candidates who by reason of their experience and qualifications, appear to be most suitable for appointment. The same Selection Board may consider a candidate at one interview for one or more of the competitions. The Selection Boards will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and training, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimate of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decisions of the Commissioners will be final and will be announced separately for the separate competitions.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

9. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignment will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

10. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

11. Fee.

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 10s. before the issue of a Certificate of Qualification for appointment.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF SUPERINTENDENTS AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENTS OF STORAGE DEPOTS UNDER THE MINISTRY OF SUPPLY.

1. Sex. Men only may compete under these regulations.

2. Age. Candidates must be at least 30 years of age on 1st April, 1950. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this Competition. In general, however, Government Departments require a

reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

3. Nationality. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

His Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the rates of charge and routes available for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to places abroad now in operation are as shown in the tables hereunder.

Every service in respect of which a charge appears in the tables is at present available. Where no charge is indicated under any heading in respect of a particular destination the relative service is not at present available. The services available to particular destinations abroad are, however, liable to be suspended and the restrictions imposed are liable to be varied from time to time by any of the telegraph administrations and private operating agencies concerned. Subject to any such restrictions telegrams may be sent to every one of the destinations in the appropriate table over the routes specified.

Except where otherwise stated the service of urgent telegrams is available at a rate per word equal to twice the rate per word for a telegram to the same destination over the same route sent at the ordinary rate.

Where the total amount of the charge for a telegram would include an odd number of farthings the charge is raised to the next higher halfpenny.

The service of delivery on ornamental forms is temporarily suspended.

The route abbreviations "Govt." or "Imperial" or "via C.T.O. London" signify that the telegram is dealt with in the U.K. by the Post Office. The route abbreviations "Commercial", "Northern", "P.Q." and "Western Union" signify that the telegram is handed over in the U.K. by the Post Office to the Commercial Cable Company, the Great Northern Telegraph Company, the French Telegraph Cable Company or the Western Union Telegraph Company respectively, for further treatment.

Radiotelegrams to Ships at Sea

The standard rate of charge for radiotelegrams routed *Wireless* or through a British land station is 1s. 0d. a word.

Radiotelegrams routed *Wireless* or through a British land station to a trawler or a ship regularly engaged on voyages not exceeding 1,000 miles to or from a port in the British Isles are charged at the reduced rate of 6d. a word. For radiotelegrams transmitted through land stations abroad the charge is made up as follows:

(1) The cost of the message as though it were an ordinary telegram (or, if the sender desires and the service of urgent telegrams is available, as though it were an urgent telegram) to the country in which the land station is situated *plus*

(2) The charge for transmission between the land station and the mobile station. This amounts to 10½d. a word in all cases except those radiotelegrams addressed to a British trawler or a short voyage British ship through a land station in Europe, when the charge is reduced to 8d. a word.

Radiotelegrams may be sent to H.M. Ships (but not to hospital ships, ocean weather ships, Royal fleet auxiliaries, transports and troop ships) at the following reduced rates:

(a) H.M. Ships in the Home Fleet or based on the Home Station—4d. a word.

(b) H.M. Ships in foreign waters or proceeding to and from a foreign naval station—7½d. a word.

Ship Letter Telegrams

The minimum charge for a ship letter telegram to places in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands through a British land station permits of the transmission of 20 words and is equal to 6s. 8d. The rate for each word over 20 is 4d.

Ship letter telegrams may be sent only in the direction from ship to shore. They may not be addressed to a mobile station.
