Omnulfions are given out for making new Levies, in order to augment the leveral Regiments of Foot which are paid by this State, by adding a Company to each Regiment. Letters from Parma fay the Garifon of Berfello has lately made two Sallies, in one of which they plundered Sorbola and two other Towns in the Parment, and in the other they destroyed some Sluyces, which the Frenco had made to deprive the Inhabitants of Berfello or the Benefit of a Rivulet which turns leveral Mills in the Town.

Rome, March 3. Since the late Earthquake several Regulations have been made, to reform the Luxury and other Vices of this Court and City. On the 22th palt the Pope ining Te Denon; and he has appointed an Anniverlary Thankigiving to be observed on the next Sunday after Candlemas Day, for our Deliverance from the Terrours of that dreadful Judgment. Several Architects, and other Persons skilled in Building, have been employed by the Pope to view the Damage which this Earthquake has done to the Vatican and other publick Buildings in this City; and they have reported, That it will cost more than a Million of Crowns to repair them. The Pope has lately held a Confi-ftory, wherein he declared the Choice he had made of Signior Pignaselli, his Nuncio in Poland, to be Archbishop of Naples.

Venice, March to. Signior Alouizio Contarini is advanced by our Senate to the Dignity of Procurator of St. Mark, upon his paying the usual Sum of 25000 Ducass. A Convoy usual Sum of 25000 Ducats. A Convoy sailed from hence sast Week for the Levant, with a Thousand Recruits and a Supply of Money and Ammunition for our Forces in those parts. Signior Justinians, Ambassador from this State to the Octoman Porte, set sail at the same time for Constantinople, with 2 Men of War, which have been appointed for his Convov. Our Advices from the French Quarters in Lomburdy say, their Troops are preparing to take the Field as foon as the Seafon permits, and expect to be thortly joyned by the Duke of Savoy's Forces. From the German Quarters they write, That Oftiglia, and all their their other Posts which are of any Importance, are fecured with very good Intrenchments, and that they are resolved to stand their Ground till they can receive Succours from Germany. Their Hussars continue to make Excursions a-

gainst the Enemy, with very good Success.

Mariemburg, March 15. A great Council of the Senators and Nobility who are in Town, will be held to morrow. The particular Diets of several Palatinates have lately mer, as well to chuse Deputies for the Diet which is to be held here the 27th Instant, 2s to consult upon the

Measures that are proper to be taken in the prefent Juncture; but some of them we hear are broke up without coming to any Refolution, by reason of the Heats and Animosities which are still prevalent among the Polish Nobility. The lesser Nobility earnestly desire a Summons from the King, to mount on Horseback for his Defence and that of their Country; but it is doubted whether he will iffue out any, being advited to the contrary by those of the best Quality, who apprehend the Disorders which the raising of this Militaries for the most cart subject to of this Militia is for the most part subject to.
In the mean time the Nobility of the Palatinates of Lublin and Podlachia have declared for the King of Sweden. We have received the Confirmation, That the Fortreis of Treozin, which was in the hands of the Swedes, has surrendred to the King of Poland's Forces, and that the Sieur Oginski, who is in his Interest, has by a Stratagem possessed himself of the Town of Birsen in Lithuames, which held out likewife for the Swedes and the House of Sapieba. Several Swedish Regiments, which were quartered at Lublin and Cafonir, have joyned their other Troops near Warfaw, and we may probably hear very foon of some Action between them and the Saxon and Lithuanian Forces which are lately advanced towards that place.

Liege, March 20. The Confederate Forces quartered in these Parts have Orders to be in a readiness to march. The Magistrates and other principal Inhabitants of this City have taken an Oath of Allegiance to the Emperor; and the Count de Zinzendorf, tis Envoy, having settled all Matters in relation to the Government of this City and its Dependencies, is upon his Return to Dusseldorp. The Baron de Tregne's Secretary being convicted of corresponding with the Enemy, is condemned to fuffer Death, Several other Persons have been seized upon suspicion of their being guilty of the same Crime. A Party of Horse of the Garison of Limbourg came two days ago into the Neighbourhood of this place, where they had begun to plunder the Country people, when a few Horse being fent out from hence against them, they immediately betook themselves to flight; however our Men wounded Two of them, whom they took Prisoners. Yesterday a Party of 50 Husfars, of those who are quartered near Sleyden, met with 100 Horse of the Garison of Limbourg, who were also making an Excursion towards this City, whom they attacked, notwithstanding the great inequality of their Numbers; and the Enemy, after a very weak Reliftance. made the best of their way home, having had 3 of their Men killed, and several wounded, without any loss on our side.

Paris, March 23. N. S. The time of the Duke of Burgundy's Departure for Bruffels is fixt to be on the 15th of the next Month; and those who are to accompany him have Orders to be in a Readiness by that time. He intends in his Journey to view the Coast of Flanders; for which

purcose

purpose be will pass by Calau, Daniech, Rempire and Offend. The French King has guen the Government of the Fort of Kell to the Sieur Baug-ri. Lieutenant Colonel of the Regiment of Or-lems, as a Remark for his Services in defending the Caffle of Transact, where he commanded during the late Blockede of that place by the Forces of the Alies Our Letters from Province are full of Complaints of the Calamities they fuffer in that Country, which is equally ravaged by the King's Forces and by the Matecontents of the Sevennes. They write from Mempellier, That on the 8th Instant a Body of the latter advanced within 4 Leagues of char place, and were attacked by a Detarmment of the King's Troops:
The Fight was obstinete, and for some time the
Advantage was equal on both sides; but at
length the Malecontents; though they behaved themselves very course only, were forced to retire with the loss of 300 Men, having killed about as many of the King's Soldiers. From Mfmes we have Advice, That there has happened a great Tumult in that Town between the old Papists and the new Converts, upon their refcuing- a Protessant who was going to be put to Death: Above 40 were killed on each side; and the Consequences of such an Accident, in a place fo near the Sevennes, appear very dangerous. Let-ters from the French Army in Italy of the 14th Instant say; the Duke of Vendofine was fortifying San Benedetto, in order to fecure to the French the Navigation of the Po downwards as far as Manzua: And that the Sieur Albergossi marched on the 10th from Modena with a Body of 600 Horse and 1500 Foot, with intent to surprise the Imperial Regiment of Dragoons of Herbeville in their Quarters at Massa and Rivera near San Felice; but notwith landing all the Diligence he could make, the Imperialists had timely Notice of his March, and he found them in a readiness to receive him; however he attacked them, and after a sharp Dispute, wherein many were killed on both fides, the French being superiour in number, obliged the Germans to retire, and took about 40 of them Prisoners. Yesterday a Courier arrived at Versailles from Strasburg, being dispatched by the Marshal de Villars, with the News that the Elector of Bavaria had defeated near Scharding a Detachment of the Imperial Army, commanded by the Count de Schlick.

Falmouth, March 20. A Dutch Privateer of Fluthing brought into this Port two days ago a French Prize of Bourdeaux, laden with Paper, and bound to Offend. Yesterday arrived here the Berry Gally of London, Peter Wall Commander, bound home from Zant. About 20 days fince, he met at Sea a French Privateer of 14 Guns, whom he fought 4 hours, and had 2 Men wounded: He could not discern what Damage the French Privateer received; but the theered off, having enough of fighting.
