COUNTY COUNCIL OF DURHAM

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 23rd day of October, 1950, the Minister of Transport modified and confirmed the County of Durham (Roads Restriction) Order, 1949, made by the County Council of Durham under Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933.

The effect of the Order, so modified will be to prohibit, with certain exceptions, the use of heavy motor vehicles on the following roads at Billingham:—

Roscoe Road.	Grange Avenue.
Rydal Avenue.	Tibbersley Avenue.
Rawlinson Avenue.	Windermere Avenue.
