Camp before that Town the 25th, and his Grace took his head Quarter on the Kruitberg. The Hereditary Prince of Hesse Cassell arrived here yesterday, and went this morning to the Camp, where 4 Regiments of Horse and 5 of Foot of the Landgrave his Father's Forces arrived yesterday, under the Command of Lieutenant-General Tertau, who has taken his Quarters at Pospolidorf. A great number of Boats with Cannon and Ammunition for this Siege are coming up the Rhine, and teveral Pontons are fant up to Mondorf, in order to the making of a Bridge there, for the Communication of the Forces which are to lie before the Town of Bon, with those that are to attack the Fort on the orher fide of the River. Several Deletters are lately come hither from therce, who report, that the Garifon does not confift of above 4000 cffective Men, part of them French, and the reft belonging to the King of Spain and the Elector of Cologne, and that there happen frequent Quarrels among them. It has been reported, that the Marquis de Varennes was to command a Body of French Forces on the Moselle, but we do not hear that any of them are yet in motion. This day an Express, dispatched by Prince Lewis of Baden to the Bishop of Reab, brought us the joyful News, That the Marihal de Villirs, after having made several unsuccessful Attacks on his Highness's Lines near Stolhoffen, had been forced to retire with confiderable Lois towards the Fort of Kehl.

Plimenth, April 25. Three Dutch Privateers came hither the 20th Instant with 8 Prizes from Estimenth, and being joined by several more from hence, sailed with them for Holland. On the 21st came in Her Majesty's Ship the Sidney from Falmouth, and under her Convoy the Min-Flower, John Foster Master, from Virginia, and the Mermaid Galley, John Martin Matter, from Jamaica, both of Lendon, and bound home. The next day came in Her Majetty's Ships the Exerce and Conturion, and under their Convoy the William and Mary of Lond n, William Rishop Master, from Leghorne, and the Bornes of London from the Esst-Indies, the Selann Galley from Virginia, bound to London, and several other Merchant Ships. In the evening a Dutch Privateer brought in a Prize, and yesterday a Privateer of Midkbourg brought in another Prize both being laden with Wine from Bour-
