Rome, April 28. N. S. The Pope has lately been very much Indisposed, but is now pretty well recovered; however it is believed the ill State of his Health will occasion the putting off his intended Journey to Loretto. He has recalled Signior Conti from the Employment of Nuncio at the Court of Portugal, in order, as is believed, to make him a Cardinal at the next Promotion, which is expected very foon; and it is faid

Signior Pignatelli, who is returning from Polana, where he has resided some time as Nuncio, Signior Coloma, Steward of the Pope's Houshold, Signior Palavicini, Signior Caffarelli, and Signior Cafoni, w. be advanced at the same time to that Dignity. The Chevalier de Vendosme, Great Prior of France, passed lately by this City in his way to Naples, from whence he will shortly return to Naples, from whence he will shortly return to the French Army, commanded by the Duka of Vendosine his Brother, in order to make the Campaign under him. We had last week the greatest Storm of Hail, Thunder, Wind and Rain, that has been known in these Parts in the Memory of Man, and it has done much damage in the Country hereabourk.
