READY-MADE & WHOLESALE BESPOKE TAILORING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Ready-made & Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1948 (Order R.M. (49)) and (2) the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by Order R.M. (49).

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below.

The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the above mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 14 days from 20th February, 1951.
