A further Order entitled the Additional Import Duties (No. 1) Order, 1951, has been made under section 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, which reduces from 33½% to 10% for a similar period, the duty chargeable on acetone under that Act.

The Orders come into operation on the 2nd March, 1951, and have been published as Statutory Instruments, 1951 Nos. 294 and 293.
