A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A DESIGN FOR A CUPRO-NICKEL COIN OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a design, hereinafter specified, for the cupronickel Crown, being one of the cupronickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one in commemoration of the Festival of Britain and of the four hundredth anniversary of the striking of the

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as

follows:

1. The design for the cupro-nickel Crown to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one shall be as follows:

Every Crown shall have for the obverse im-Every Crown shall have for the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VID: G: BR: OMN: REX F: D: ", together with the words "FIVE SHILLINGS", and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year "1951", and upon the edge in incuse letters the inscription "MDCCCLI CIVIUM INDUSTRIA FLORET CIVITAS MCMLI".

hands of the sequestrator of the said united benefice at the date of the dissolution of the said union shalf be transferred to us by the sequestrator and shall be applied by us in equal proportions towards the capital endowment of each of the said separate benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach.

The annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 aforesaid shall be charged in equal proportions upon the endowments of the benefice of Burgh, Clopton and Debach, that is to say, the endowments of the said benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach shall said benefices of Burgh, Clopton and Debach shall each respectively be charged with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £33 6s. 8d. in favour of the incumbent for the time being of the said united benefice of Wickham Market with Lowdham and Pettistree, who shall have and be entitled to the said powers and remedies in respect of the recovery of each such yearly rentcharge of £33 6s. 8d. as he possesses in respect of the said yearly rentcharge of £100.
- "5. The recommendations aforesaid shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"1. Union of Benefices.—The benefice of Tetbury and the benefice of Beverston shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Tetbury and Beverston' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

Taking effect of union.—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend William Somers Llewellyn if he is then Incumbent of the said benefice of Tetbury shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

substitute assistance the bishop of the diocese shall have power to give to the incumbent such directions as to the employment of such assistance as to the said bishop appears appropriate.

(c) In the said portion of the Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
