PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of March, 1951 (N. 10953/50) in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council dated 26th day of June, 1930, provided certain rates of extra pay for Divers, as laid down in the Schedule thereto; that a gratuity of £5 or £10 according to the depth of dive, be paid in certain circumstances in lieu of payment by scale; that time spent in a decompression chamber be included in the time for which the extra pay is payable; and that the attendant accommodated in the decompression chamber be paid the rates of extra pay applicable to the depth to which the chamber is submerged:

"And whereas Orders in Council dated 26th day of October, 1899, and 22nd day of January, 1942, sanctioned payment at 3s. 6d. an hour to Commissioned

Gunners, R.N. in charge of diving instruction in any ship or establishment, when actually employed under water:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to modify these arrangements with effect from 1st day of July, 1949, to provide that extra pay shall be assessed on the number of minutes actually spent under water or pressure; that a diver's attendant shall be paid at a fixed proportion of the sum paid to the diver he attends: and that officers employed in charge of diving instruction shall be eligible for extra pay by scale instead of at an hourly rate:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the rates of extra pay and other provisions set out in the annexed Schedules:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE I.

"Diving Extra Pay to be payable at the following rates to:—

"(a) qualified officers and men, including any officer who has completed a course at a Diving School and whose duties necessitate his going under water or pressure, when using any approved diving apparatus during diving operations carried out with the authority of the Commanding Officer;

"(b) officers and men of the Submarine Branch qualified in the use of the Davis Submerged Escape Apparatus when using this apparatus in shallow water diving operations with the authority of the Commanding Officer.

"SCHEDULE II.

"Gratuity or Bonus in lieu of Diving Pay.—A gratuity not exceeding £5 to be given, if desired, in lieu of payment by scale in exceptional circumstances requiring dispatch and for important skilled work satisfactorily performed (such as clearance diving on live mines), of which gratuity one-fifth to be paid to the attendant. When the depth dived is in excess of 30 fathoms, the gratuity to be increased to a maximum of £10.

"2. For recovery of articles, a bonus not exceeding one-fourth of the value of the article and not in any circumstances more than £1 to be given, if desired, in lieu of payment by scale, of which bonus one-fifth to be paid to the attendant."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Salisbury Diocesan Board of Patronage and of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the diocese in which the said benefice is situate (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Salisbury Diocesan Board of Patronage and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Salisbury Diocesan Board of Patronage."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making an alteration in the provisions of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 26th day of February, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the following day for effecting, *inter alia*, the union of the benefice of Slaidburn with a part of the benefice of Dale Head, Saint James, both situate in the county of York and the diocese of Bradford.

"SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME.
