**THE PETERLEE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION
(CASTLE EDEN DENES).**

COMPULSORY PURCHASE ORDER, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Peterlee Development Corporation in pursuance of their powers under Section 4 (1) of the New Towns Act, 1946, on the 4th day of April, 1951, made an Order which has been submitted for confirmation by the Minister of Local Government and Planning authorising them to purchase compulsorily for the purposes of Section 2 (2) of the New Towns Act, 1946, the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the office of the General Manager to the Peterlee Development Corporation, Shotton Hall, Castle Eden in the County of Durham and will be open for inspection without payment of fee during normal office hours.

Any objection to the Order must be made in writing, stating the grounds of the objection and addressed to the Minister of Local Government and Planning, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 7th day of May, 1951.

The Minister is not in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such statement.

Any owner or occupier of any land to which the Order relates may send to the Peterlee Development Corporation at the address below a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where a copy of the Order and of the map and of any descriptive matter annexed thereto may be seen. Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the lands of the owner or occupier and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.

The lands, woodlands and plantations known as Castle Eden Dene and Blunts Denes together with the Garden of Eden Cottage, Castle Eden; the Dene Cottage near Horden, and the Keepers Cottage, near Oakerside Farm, Castle Eden, all in the County of Durham.

NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1949.

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF BEESTON AND STAPLEFORD.

Beeston and Stapleford Long Lane Recreation Ground Footpath Diversion Order, 1950.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 14th day of March, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the order is to extinguish the public right of way commencing in Long Lane at the southern corner of the Long Lane Recreation Ground and proceeding in a northerly direction diagonally across the said ground a distance of 470 feet to the north-eastern boundary of the said ground and to divert the same by means of a public right of way on foot commencing at the last-mentioned point and proceeding in an easterly or south-easterly direction

a distance of 341 feet and terminating in Long Lane at a point 414 feet distant in a north-easterly direction from the point of commencement of the existing public right of way.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Town Hall, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Notts., and will be open for inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

The order becomes operative as from the 10th day of April, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
