Tenison Way (Northern Arm).	From south to north.
Tenison Way (Southern Arm).	From east to west.
Waterloo Road (from its junction with the northern arm of Tenison Way to its junction with the southern arm of Tenison Way).	From north-west to south-east.
Mephram Street (including both arms).	From west to east.

and (II) prohibiting a right-hand turn from:—

- (a) Waterloo Road into Exton Street.
 (b) York Road into Mephram Street.
 (c) the north-western arm of Mephram Street into Waterloo Road.
