Borough of Stourbridge Ham Dingle Footpath Diversion Order, 1950.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 16th day of March, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above order.

The effect of the order will be to divert to a line nearer the stream part of the public right of way running from Ham Lane through Ham Dingle in the direction of Wollescote.

A certified copy of the order and of the map contained in the order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Council House, Stourbridge, and will be open to inspection

free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The order becomes operative as from the 16th day of March, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the power of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinderpest (*pestis-bovina*), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*), 1898; sheep pox (*variola ovium*), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*), 1906; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*), 1928. Dourine (*exanthema colitae paralyticum*) has never existed in Great Britain.
