At the 1 ither end of Lan-hill his Grace was met by the Lord Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen, in their Formaliries, and proceeded to the Conneil Chamber, where his Commission was read and the usual Oaths were administred to him by the Lord Bishop of Kildare: Then his Grace, attended by the Lords and others of the Privy Council, the-King at Arms, Purfuivants, and other Publick Officers, went to the Castie, where he was faluted at his Entrance by a Difcharge of 15 Pieces of Cannon, and foon after by 3 Salvo's of 21 Guns each, and as many Volleys of the imall Arms of the two Regiments of Foot above-mentioned, which were in the lower Castle-yard, and of the Militia on College Green. And in the evening there were Bonnies, Illuminations, and other publick Rejoycings.
