

was met by a great number of the Nobility and Gentry in their Coaches, and on Horseback, and attended by two Troops of Brigadier-General *Harvey's* Regiment of Horse. His Grace was saluted as he passed by *Ringsend* with a Discharge of the Cannon there, as he was likewise upon his approaching to *Lazy-hill*, where he was met by several Troops of the Militia, Horse and Dragoons, who facing about, led up the March: They were followed by the Sheriffs Officers and Retinues; after them marched an Officer with 12 Horse, belonging to the two Troops above-named; Then came his Grace in his Coach, on each side whereof were the two Scourers, and the Persons of Quality and Gentlemen who attended his Grace on Horseback; then followed the rest of the two Troops. The Lords Justices Coaches came next, and were followed by his Grace's Train, and a great number of Coaches of the Nobility and Gentry, which made a very magnificent Shew; and the People in great Crowds made loud Acclamations, and gave all other Demonstrations of Joy and Satisfaction. At the further end of *Lazy-hill* his Grace was met by the Lord Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen, in their Formalities, and proceeded to the Council Chamber, where his Commission was read, and the usual Oaths were administered to him by the Lord Bishop of *Kildare*: Then his Grace, attended by the Lords and others of the Privy Council, the King at Arms, Pursuivants, and other Publick Officers, went to the Castle, where he was saluted at his Entrance by a Discharge of 15 Pieces of Cannon, and soon after by 3 Salvo's of 21 Guns each, and as many Volleys of the small Arms of the two Regiments of Foot above-mentioned, which were in the lower Castle-yard, and of the Militia on *College Green*. And in the evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other publick Rejoycings.

*Plymouth, June 4.* A Privateer called the *Haught of Zealand*, Captain *Vander Meer* Commander, came into this Port the 2d Instant, with the *Star of Horne*, a Dutch Merchant Ship bound home from *St. Ubes*, which he had retaken to the Westward.

*Perthmouth, June 6.* Vice-Admiral *Vander-goes* came last night to *Spirhead* with 3 Dutch Men of War. Two Dutch Men of War more, with divers Merchant Ships under their Convoy, are passed by towards *Tosham*.

The Dutch Mail of Friday last is not yet come in.

*Windsor, June 2.* The Rt. Hon. John Lord Granville, Lord Warden of the *Stannaries*, having humbly laid before Her Majesty several Petitions presented to his Lordship from the Gentlemen and Tynners of *Cornwall* and *Devon*, praying a Convocation or Parliament of *Stannaries* may be convened and holden for their respective *Stannaries*, as anciently has been accustomed in the Reigns of Her Royal Predecessors: Her Majesty thereupon has been graciously pleased to direct, That a Commission be forthwith issued to empower his Lordship to convene and hold the same with all convenient speed.
