BOROUGH OF TORQUAY

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay (hereinafter called "the Corporation") have made application to the Minister of Local Government and Planning (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an order under paragraph (5) of section 297 and section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875 partly to alter or amend section 153 of the Torquay Corporation Act, 1923 (hereinafter called "the local Act") as amended by the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Torquay) Act, 1947, so as:—

(1) To authorise the Corporation to pay out of the general rate fund the reasonable expenses incurred by them in the reception and entertainment of distinguished bodies and persons residing in or visiting the Borough and on any occasion of public rejoicing or ceremony an amount not exceeding the equivalent of three times the amount produced by a rate of one penny in the pound instead of, as provided by the local Act, an amount not exceeding the equivalent of the amount produced by a rate of one penny in the pound;

(2) For the several purposes of the application, or for purposes connected with, incidental to or consequent upon those purposes, to make such alteration or amendment of the said local Act or of any other local Act, or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the Borough, as may be necessary or desirable:

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF QUESTION BY THE MINISTER OF NATIONAL INSURANCE.

Actors, Musicians and Variety Artistes.

Under Section 41 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the Minister of National Insurance has asked the National Insurance Advisory Committee:

"To consider the position under the National Insurance Act of actors, musicians, variety and other artistes engaged in the entertainment industry and to advise as to their appropriate classification in the national insurance scheme, and, in particular, in what circumstances and under what conditions any such persons should be treated as employed persons."

The Committee will take into consideration representations from organisations and persons concerned with this question.
