*PAPER BAG WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).*

The Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1948 (Order P. (43)) as amended by the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1951 (Order P. (48)) and (2) for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by Order P. (43) as amended by Order P. (48).
