UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division) to:—

4026728 Leading Aircraftman William John Mitchell BRODIE, Royal Air Force, Royal Air Force Station, Safi.

On 28th January, 1951, a Solent Flying Boat of Trans Oceanic Airways carrying 8 crew and 39 passengers, overturned on take-off at Marsaxlokk, Malta. Leading Aircraftman Brodie was a member of the crew of Seaplane Tender 1599 which went to the assistance of the occupants. On seeing one of the passengers in difficulties in the water about 30 yards off (he had drifted away from the main body of passengers who were being rescued by Royal Air Force Marine craft) Brodie immediately got permission to leave his boat and, casting off only his jacket and his boots, dived into the water to render assistance. Although the drowning man was fully clothed but not wearing a lifebelt, Leading Aircraftman Brodie kept him afloat for some five minutes. By this time the passenger had lost consciousness, thereby becoming a dead weight. Despite this, Leading Aircraftman Brodie continued in his attempt to bring him alongside the craft which were engaged in rescuing the others from the water and the overturned aircraft. There was a wind of 20-25 m.p.h. and a slight swell, and he was unable to make his objective. Eventually both Brodie and the passenger disappeared under the water but Leading Aircraftman Brodie persisted in his efforts to effect a rescue. Ultimately he had to release his hold, being himself picked up in a most exhausted condition.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF RESEARCH ASSISTANT GRADE II, OR RESEARCH ASSISTANT GRADE I IN THE NATIONAL MUSEUM OF ANTIQUITIES OF SCOTLAND, EDINBURGH.

1. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took

effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment under these regulations unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

2. (i) Candidates for appointment to Grade II must be at least 22 and under 26 years of age on 1st January, 1951. But

(a) candidates who have served or are serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may, for this purpose, deduct the period of such service from their actual age;

(b) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a Certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

(ii) Candidates for appointment to Grade I must be at least 26 years of age on 1st January, 1951. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for appointment to this grade. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering any candidates for this post who are over 50 years of age.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. A person upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together as in the Commissioners' opinion fits them for the post.

A University degree (preferably in an Arts subject), the Museum Association's Diploma and a knowledge of several modern languages are desirable additional qualifications.

6. Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board in Edinburgh which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidate who appears to be most suitable. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendation that they may receive from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview, and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

7. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons (except as referees to be named by them in their application form) will disqualify them for appointment. The

Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

8. The successful candidate must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to health and character. A fee of 15s. will be payable before the issue by the Commissioners of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT AMONG MEMBERS OF THE MINOR AND MANIPULATIVE GRADES OF THE CIVIL SERVICE TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE AND TO GRADE 6 POSTS IN BRANCH B OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be under 30 years of age on the 1st September, 1951.

2. Grades eligible.

Candidates must at the time of the examination be either

(a) members of the established Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council that is to say, non-industrial grades, other than the General and Departmental Clerical Classes, on scales of salary rising to not more than the maxima, for men and women respectively, of the salary scales of those classes as they were on 1st May, 1951, disregarding any retrospective adjustments of scales which may be made after that date; or

(b) members of an unestablished grade corresponding to an established grade covered by (a).

Clerical Assistants and members of the typing grades will not be eligible to compete. In the case of an officer who on 1st May, 1951, is substantively an established member of one of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council, but who has received acting promotion, it is the substantive grade on the 1st May, 1951, which determines eligibility under this Regulation.

3. Length of Service.

(a) Candidates whose full-time adult service began on or after 1st June, 1946, must be at least 25 years of age and must have had not less than three years' full-time service on duties proper to an adult class.

These conditions apply also to candidates who entered the Post Office as Boy Messengers or Girl Probationers on or after the 2nd April, 1945.

(b) Candidates whose full-time adult service began on or before 31st May, 1946 (and also all candidates who entered the Post Office as Boy Messengers or Girl Probationers before the 2nd April, 1945, including those who may not have entered upon full-time adult service until after 31st May, 1946) must either

(i) have had not less than three years' full-time service on duties proper to an adult class (without any minimum age limit); or

(ii) have reached the age of 22 and have had not less than one year's full-time service on such duties.

In all cases the conditions must be satisfied by the first day of the examination, and the service must have been continuous.

4. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women are eligible.

(ii) Married women are not eligible for appointment to Branch B of the Foreign Service; a woman member of Branch B must resign her appointment on marriage.

(iii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who retired compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before the 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment to the Home Civil Service

unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

5. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

6. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Examination.

The examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. English.

2. Arithmetic.

3. General Knowledge.

4. One of the following:—

Mathematics, French, German, History, Geography, Economics.

Candidates who include Branch B of the Foreign Service among their preferences for appointment, if successful, must take either French or German as subject 4. Successful candidates will not be considered for appointment to Branch B of the Foreign Service unless they reach in the examination a satisfactory standard in either French or German and subsequently establish, in an interview at the Foreign Office, that they are in other respects suitable for appointment to the Foreign Service.

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit according to the aggregate number of marks in the examination as a whole, and no candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not obtain such an aggregate as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners. Not more than one-third of the vacancies to be filled from the examination will be available for persons serving as Postal and Telegraph Officers in the Post Office.

8. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

9. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

10. A fee of 7s. 6d. is payable by all candidates. This must be sent with the application form, and is not returnable in any circumstances.

The application form must be accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the Department in which the candidate is serving in the space provided on the application form, that he (or she) satisfies the conditions laid down in Clauses 2 and 3 of these Regulations and that his (or her) service has been approved.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competition will be held under the above Regulations commencing on the 11th September, 1951.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 5th July, 1951, an application on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
