CONGLETON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Congleton Rural District Council (Wornish Nook-Marton) Public Path Diversion Order, 1950.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th day of June, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Wornish Nook, Somerford Booths, through Grove House to Marton to a line running from a point approximately 183 yards south of Grove House Farm through Plot Nos. 167 and 169 Ches. Sheet XLIII 5 and 9 to a point approximately 350 yards north of Grove House Farm.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Middlewich Road, Sandbach and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays and 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 31st day of May, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

PEACOCK, SPENCROFT, CANNEL ROW AND GREAT ROW SEAMS UNDERLYING LANDS AT WOLSTANTON AND NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME.

In the Matter of the MINES (WORKING FACILITIES AND SUPPORT ACTS, 1923 and 1925 and in the Matter of the MINING INDUSTRY ACT, 1926 and in the Matter of an ORDER OF THE COURT OF THE RAILWAY AND CANAL COMMISSION DATED 17TH DECEMBER, 1943, MADE ON AN APPLICATION OF WOLSTANTON LIMITED and in the Matter of an APPLICATION OF THE NATIONAL COAL BOARD.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Court of the Railway and Canal Commission dated the 17th December, 1943, there was granted to Wolstanton Limited the right, which is now vested in the National Coal Board (hereinafter referred to as the Applicants) to let down the surface of certain lands in the Parishes of Wolstanton and Newcastle-under-Lyme in the County of Stafford (hereinafter referred to as "the said lands") by working the coal in the Great Row Seam and certain ironstone and coal in the Red Mine Ironstone Seam subject to certain provisions for the leaving of pillars of coal for the protection of certain surface properties, but there was not granted to Wolstanton Limited any right to let down the surface of the said lands by working any coal in the Peacock, Spencroft or Cannel Row Seams.

And whereas by an Originating Summons in the High Court of Justice (1951 W. No. 1827) under the above mentioned Acts and Matters the Applicants seek an Order:—

(1) Granting them the right to let down the surface of the said lands by working in addition to the Coal in the Great Row Seam, the coal in the Peacock, the Spencroft and the Cannel Row Seams underlying the said lands.

(2) Varying Clauses 4, 5, 6 and 8 of the said Order dated 17th December, 1943 by granting the Applicants right of working coal in the Great Row Seam within certain areas of the said pillars of coal therein mentioned.

(3) for other variations consequential upon the Application and the Coal Industry Nationalisation Act 1946 and the Transport Act 1947.
