"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Supplementary Scheme, under Section 11 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 4th day of March, 1949, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the same month for effecting the union of the benefice and parish of Weaste, St. Luke, and the benefice and parish of Weaste, All Saints, both situate in the diocese of Manchester.

"SUPPLEMENTARY SCHEME

"Whereas by Clause 6 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council it was directed that upon the union of the said benefices taking effect (i) the incumbent of the united benefice should employ a second curate to assist principally (but not to the exclusion of general duties in the united parish) in the ministrations of All Saints Church; Provided that in the event of the services of a whole-time second curate not being available the said incumbent should employ such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop should from time to time direct; and (ii) a portion of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £282 (being part of a larger annual payment made by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Weaste, All Saints) should be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of such assistance as aforesaid and such fund should be paid by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the diocese as trustees to apply it accordingly:

"And whereas the union of the said benefices and parishes took effect on the 8th day of March, 1949:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and we are satisfied that since the making of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council the circumstances of the said benefices have so changed as to render it expedient that the directions contained in Clause 6 of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council should be altered:

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in witness whereof

he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the said Order of Your Majesty in Council shall be altered as follows, that is to say:—

"There shall be substituted for the said Clause 6 the following new Clause:—

'6. Clerical or lay assistance. After the union has taken effect—

(i) the incumbent of the united benefice shall employ (a) a curate to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice and (b) such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop shall from time to time direct to assist in the ministrations of All Saints Church:

(ii) a portion of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £282 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Weaste, All Saints) shall be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of employing any such curate (or substituted assistance when a curate is not available) and other assistance as aforesaid and such fund shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the diocese as trustees to apply it accordingly."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Supplementary Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Supplementary Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Supplementary Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the application of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the appropriation of the old church of

Saint Michael, situate in the parish of Saint Michael, Frosterley, in the diocese of Durham.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Instrument under the seal of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England pursuant to the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter 70, and to the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 55, and dated the 25th day of November, 1869, the new church called Saint Michael, Frosterley, was substituted for the old church of Saint Michael, Frosterley, as the parish church of the parish of Saint Michael, Frosterley:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Church Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the said old church of Saint Michael, Frosterley, should be appropriated for certain educational or charitable or other purposes as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham (testified by his signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that so soon as conveniently may be after the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said old church of Saint Michael, Frosterley, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Measures, be appropriated for any educational or charitable purpose or purposes in connection with the Church of England, having in view the spiritual, intellectual, moral or social welfare of the parishioners of the said parish of Saint Michael, Frosterley, and others or either exclusively or in conjunction with any such purposes as aforesaid for use or occupation by any diocesan body or organisation or otherwise for the furtherance of the work of the Church of England or the administration of its affairs, and such appropriation shall be subject to such conditions, regulations and provisions as the Bishop of Durham shall by deed made pursuant to the 24th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, declare and appoint."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and of the Acts mentioned therein have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of a share of and in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said benefices') of (1) Candlesby with Scremby and (2) Swaby with South Thoresby both in the diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Candlesby with Scremby is at present exercisable alternately by the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called 'the said President and Scholars') and George Henry Bowser of the Firs, Friskney, Boston, in the County of Lincoln, Esquire, and that the right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Swaby with South Thoresby is at present exercisable alternately by the said President and Scholars and by Your Majesty in right of Your Duchy of Lancaster:

"And whereas the said President and Scholars desire to transfere the said two alternate rights of

patronage exercisable by them as aforesaid to the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the alternate share at present exercisable by the said President and Scholars of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said benefices shall be transferred to the said Maurice, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of June, 1950, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared for effecting the union of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease both situate in the diocese of Ely.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas a Commission of Inquiry pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, has reported to the Bishop of Ely recommending the union of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, and the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease, and the said Bishop of Ely has signified in writing his approval of the report:

"And whereas this Scheme for the union of the said benefices, which has been prepared by us, the said Church Commissioners, is based upon the terms recommended in the said report but with the consent of the said Bishop of Ely embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas by an Act of the 7th and 8th years of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, Chapter XCII intituled 'An Act for erecting and endowing a Chapel of Ease in the Parish of Wisbech Saint Peter's in the Isle of Ely in the County of Cambridge' provision was made for the appointment of trustees for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act:

"And whereas the said Act further provides that the right of presenting a minister to the said Chapel shall vest in a committee consisting of five of the said Trustees elected for that purpose by the Trustees at one of their meetings:

"And whereas the said Act further provides that if the said Committee fails to present a minister within six calendar months of the date of the avoidance of the preceding minister of the Chapel the turn of presentation shall lapse to the Bishop of

the Diocese, the Metropolitan and the Crown successively in order and course of law:

"And whereas the Reverend Eric Vincent Talbot ceased to be minister of the said Chapel on the fifth day of September, 1946, and since that date there has been no minister of the said Chapel:

"And whereas certain doubts have arisen as to who are the patrons of the said Chapel for the purposes of this Scheme:

"And whereas so far as can be ascertained William Robert Girling of The Castle, Wisbech, in the County of Cambridge, Esquire, Henry Garrard Ayers, of Netherby, Elm, Wisbech, in the County of Cambridge, Esquire, Mary Elizabeth May Jackson, of Hamilton House, Goodwins Road, King's Lynn, Norfolk. Married Woman, and the Reverend John Parker Pelloe, incumbent of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, are the present trustees of the said Chapel:

"And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, the said Church Commissioners have decided that a majority of the said trustees shall be the patrons of the said Chapel for the purposes of this Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, and the Reverend John Parker Pelloe, as incumbent of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, have signed this Scheme in witness of their consent thereto:

"And whereas the said William Robert Girling, the said Mary Elizabeth May Jackson, and the said Reverend John Parker Pelloe, acting as a majority of the said trustees, have also signed this Scheme in witness (so far as it is required) of the consent thereto of the patrons of the said Chapel:

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Union of Benefices*: The benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul and the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul'.

"2. *Taking effect of Union*: Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend John Parker Pelloe, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House*: Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith may be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, for a nominal consideration to such body as will accept it on trust to be used as a house of residence of both or either of the curates employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice and if not so sold within such period as we, after consultation with the Bishop of Ely, may determine shall be sold by us, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of any such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Ely established pursuant to the said Measures.

"4. *Patronage*: The whole rights of patronage in respect of the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease, shall without any conveyance or assurance other than this Scheme be surrendered in favour of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely, and his successors, Bishops of Ely, to the intent that the whole patronage of the united benefice of Wisbech, Saint Peter and Saint Paul, shall belong to and be exercisable by the said Bishop of Ely and his successors.

"5. *Clerical or other assistance*: (1) Upon the union taking effect a second curate shall be employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, but in the event of the services of a whole-time second curate not being available the incumbent shall employ such other clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop shall from time to time direct.

"(2) Upon the union taking effect there shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing

such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely (a) the endowments specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto and (b) any moneys remaining in the hands of any sequestrators of the said benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease at the close of the sequestration and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"6. *Taking down of Church*: (a) So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect The Wisbech Chapel of Ease shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times, and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the said Chapel of Ease, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be appropriated and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the augmentation of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Augustine, in the said diocese of Ely.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Chapel of Ease shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Chapel of Ease, or such of them as the bishop shall select, shall also be removed to some other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Chapel of Ease, as aforesaid.

"7. *Diversion of Endowments*: Upon the union taking effect the endowments specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto shall be severed and diverted from the said benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated and held for the augmentation of the said benefice of Wisbech, Saint Augustine.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" Part I.

"Endowments at present belonging to the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease and held by the Church Commissioners to be appropriated upon the union taking effect as a fund towards the cost of providing clerical or other assistance in the united benefice.

Nature of Endowment:

(a) £6,666 13s. 4d. 3% Redemption Stock (1986/96.)

(b) £2,000 0s. 0d. 2½% Treasury Stock (1975/).

"Endowments at present belonging to the benefice of The Wisbech Chapel of Ease and held by the Church Commissioners to be appropriated for the augmentation of the benefice of Wisbech, Saint Augustine, upon the union taking effect.

Nature of Endowment:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ely has

been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an Appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by The Wisbech Society and Preservation Trust Ltd. and S. A. Whitteridge, Esquire, and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the 9th day of October, 1950:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, have taken the said Appeal into consideration and, the Appellants having intimated the withdrawal of the said Appeal, have reported to His Majesty in Council that the Appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 31st day of May, 1951, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Peter, Staines; Laleham; and Ashford in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution* :

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish, as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Christ Church, Staines'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery* :

The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex and in the rural deanery of Hampton.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Saint Peter, Staines (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto), which lies to the east of the middle of Kingston Road and Worples Road.

"(b) (i) All that contiguous part of the parish of Laleham (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of the middle of the more southerly of the two parallel roads each known as Pavilion Gardens and to the west of the middle of Templedene Avenue.

"(ii) All that portion of the parish of Laleham (coloured green on the map annexed hereto), which is bounded upon the south-east by the parish of Littleton, upon the north-east and north by the parish of Ashford, upon the north-west and west by the parish of Saint Peter, Staines, and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Laleham from the parish of Saint Peter, Staines, opposite to the western end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 19 Thickthorne Lane and continuing thence generally eastwards first and then along the said wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the northern side of Arnold Road and continuing thence in the same straight line first to and then along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as Number 319 Ashford Road from the house and premises known as Number 321 Ashford Road and in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Laleham from the parish of Littleton, thereby crossing Ashford Road and the closes numbered 34 and 7 on the map annexed hereto.

"(c) All that contiguous portion of the parish of Ashford (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south and west of the middle of the River Ash."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Alphage, Hendon; and Saint John, West Hendon, in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution* :

"(a) As from the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of consecration of a church within the area approved by us as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Matthias, Colindale'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery* :

"The district and parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Hampstead and in the rural deanery of Hendon.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The said benefice of Saint George, Preston, and the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Preston, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint George, Preston,' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Arnold Stanley Picton if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Preston, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Saint George, Preston shall be the parish church of the united parish.

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereupon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall so far as necessary be applied to the cost of such alteration and improvement of the said church of Saint George, Preston, as upon the petition of the incumbent of the united benefice the Consistory Court of the said diocese shall by faculty approve and the balance, if any, of the said proceeds shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Blackburn established pursuant to the said Measures.

"(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of the Holy Trinity, Preston, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint George, Preston, or to some other church or churches within the said diocese of Blackburn and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of the Holy Trinity, Preston, or such of them as the Bishop of Blackburn shall select, shall be removed to the church of Saint George, Preston, or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the diocese of Blackburn which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the materials and site of the said church of the Holy Trinity, Preston, as aforesaid.

"7. *Diversion of Endowments.* Upon the union taking effect the endowments specified in the schedule annexed hereto shall be severed or diverted from the benefice of Saint George, Preston, and from the united benefice of Saint George, Preston, and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Blackburn as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.
