River Great Ouse Catchment Board.

Bedfordshire First Internal Drainage District.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Order:—

Statutory Instruments 1951 No. 1206.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 17, 1951.

(Made 2nd July, 1951.)

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Alloa, Clackmannanshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Clackmannan, Dunbarton, Fife, Lanark, Perth and Kinross, Stirling and West Lothian.
