NOTICE is hereby given that on the 26th day of June, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from the northern boundary of Enclosure Number 85 on the Ordnance Survey

Plan 263/1 1932 edition, situate within the Parish of Ryhill in the West Riding of the County of York, across the said Enclosure in a south-easterly direction to the railway bridge on its eastern boundary, to a line running from the same point on the northern boundary of the said Enclosure along the said northern boundary on its southern side in an easterly direction and then along the said Enclosure's eastern boundary on its western side to the railway bridge aforesaid.
