HE Eagle, John Davison Commander, an Engliso Merchant Ship fitted out by Sir Jeffrey Jeffreys, is come in here, who the 10th of the last Month, in the evening, about 45 Leagues West of Labon, engaged 2 French Ship of 14 Guns and 8 Patercioes, and after a sharp Dispute, which lasted two hours that night, and 4 the next morning, took her, and brought her hither: She proves to be very richly laden, and is called the Thomas of Granville, Captain John Dry Commander, had 40 Seamen and Passensers on board, whereof one was killed, and the Captain, with 9 of his Men, were wounded. The English Ship had the same number of Guns, but had only 32 Men on board, of whom there is not one killed or wounded.

Bafle, June 30. The Diet of the Swift Cantons is to meet again in two or three days, to confider of the Proposals made by the French Ambassador about the Conveyance of Letters from Alface to the French Army commanded by the Marsnal de Villars. Letters from Alface give an Account, that by the Negligence of a Servant a great Fire has happened in the Duke of Burgundy's Quarters at Langenscheydell, whereby all his Bagger and several of his Horses, were destroyed, and the Loss amounts to a very considerable Sum. Letters from Lyans of the 22d Instant say, the Sevennois grow daily more numerous, and have frequently successful Rencounters with the French King's Forces; That a Party of them came not long since to Obessadors, near User, and fixed to Declaration, whereupon 5 Troops or Deagoons marched thitter the next day to take it down; but the Malecantents having notice of it, a Body of them came down from the Mountains, and sell upon the King's Forces with such sury, that not above 30 of them returned home.

Ratisbane, July 9. The Imperial Diet met the 5th Instant, and the Electoral College rook into Consideration the Project which was laid before them some time 250, for the sublitting and better regulating the Army of the Empire, which was finally lettled by that College the next day, and will this day be considered in the College of Princes. The Elector of Empire, continues with his Army near Inspruck, where ne is regulating the Government of that part of Tirel, from which he has already demanded Homage, and a Monthly Contribution of 120000 Florius, betides a great quantity of Provisions and Ammunition. In the mean time has sent out several Detachments to make himself Master of the remaining Passes on those Frontiers; One of them is now attacking Ekraburg, a Place equally strong by Nature and Art, where they have hithertomet with a vigorous Resistance; Another Body of 600 Men, commanded by the Count at Tauskirchen and the Count de Noont, endeavoured to seize the Passes in the Mountain of Abelevberg, and to open a way into the Country of the Grison, but was repulsed with the Lois of noo Men by part of the Garison of Bregentz, which had been timely posted at Landsey, at the soot of those Mountains, and had been joined by about 2000 of the Militia and Instant by part of the Dragoons of Barreite, and Tome Fraishers from Bregentz, left the Enemy should strake ancher Attempt; A third Party of the Fraish and Brazis. On the 5th Instant the Regency at Manich sent a Secretary to the Town of Aughburg, to propose to them either to admit a Bavarian Garison, to deliver up one of their Gares into the hands of the Elector, or to give Hostages for their observing an exact Neutrality; which last Condition it is supposed they will comply with.

with. Francfort, July 19. The Forces of the Circle of Weltphalia are advanced to Wishaden, and are to pais the Majn this day or to morrow at Cofficient, near Menta, in order to continue their March towards the Upper Rhine. The 5 Regiments which the King of Pruffia is fending thither are come within 9 or 10 Leagues or this Place. The French Army under the Command of the Marshal de Inland is marched into the Neighbourhood of Fort Louis; and we are assured that the Duke of Bargundy is gone back to France; the' some cletters say, that he intends, before he returns thither, to cross the Rhine at Fort Louis, in order to attack General Thingen, whose Army lies now encamped over against that Place, to dispute the Passage with the Enemy.
