Lublin, July 4. N. S.

General Diet is still assembled, and has reforced to augment the Forces of the Crov'n to 36000 Men, that they may be able to make head against the Sweder, and to raife several Subsilies to carry on the War, in case Marters come to an open Rupture between that Crown and the Republick. It has been proposed. That fince the Princes of the House of Nanicha have publickly appeared for the Smedish Interest, they should be depived of their Honours, and the Great Places they enjoy in the Government; however their Friends have prevailed to Pave this Matter deferred till the Meeting of the Nobility on Horisback, called the Passacce Para-Nobility on Horseback, called the Posspolite Razzenie; to hasten which the King has islued a second Summons to them to repair to Golumb, where those of the Palatinates of Sniomir and Cracaw are already encamped. The Museumite Ambassa. dor uses great Endravours to persuade the Polish Grandees to the War; but we are not without hopes that Matters may be brought to a friendly Accommodation. Warfaw, July 5. The Imperial Envoy has already sent his Secretary to know his last Resolutions in relation to the continuing of the War, or bringing Matters to an Accommodation.

Rasisbome, July 16. We have not yet the Particulars of the taking of the Castle of Ebrenberg in Tirol by the Bavarians, though all Advices from thence agree as to its being furrendered to them; and fome Letters add, that they found there a good quantity of all forts of Provisions, which were deligned for the Imperial Army in Italy. The Elector was on the 11th Inflant with the best part of his Army still near Inspruck, from whence he had sent a strong Detrehment to disperse the Regular Troops and Militia which are got together at Schneeberg, and to endeavour to open a Passage to Brixen: Whether the French will endeavour to join him with a Detachment from their Army in Italy is yet unknown to us, being still without Lecters from Haly, because of the Stop put to the Post from thence by the Bawarians being in Tirol. The Imperial and the French Atmies on the Danube continue in the same Camps. Letters from thence of the 13th fay, that Prince Lewis was railing several Batteries to Cannonado the Enemy in their Camp. On the 11th the Bawarian, Town of Wimbding near Donawerth was furrendred to the Imperial General Polifs. On the 12th the Margrave of Bareith, with the Forces under his Command, broke up from Nordlingen, and marched to Difhlingen, in order to join Prince

Lewis.

Francfort, July 18. We hear the Princh Army commanded by the Duke of Burgundy pailed over the Rhine the 16th Instant at Kehl, but upon what Design is not yet known; The Rhine being much swelled by the late great Rains, has overshowed in Banks, which purthen to some Inconveniency in their March, and has made Forege very scarce. General Thungen, upon notice of their Motions, has drawn to him at Stolkesson. He imperial Troops which were posted near Philipsbourg.
