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Lublin, July 4. N. S.

THE General Diet is still assembled, and has resolv'd to augment the Forces of the Crown to 36000 Men, that they may be able to make head against the Swedes, and to raise several Subsidies to carry on the War, in case Matters come to an open Rupture between the Crown and the Republick. It has been propos'd, That since the Princes of the House of Saxe have publickly appeared for the Swedish Interest, they should be deprived of their Honours, and the Great Places they enjoy in the Government; however their Friends have prevailed to have this Matter deferr'd till the Meeting of the Nobility on Horseback, called the *Pöspolitic Razzenie*; to hasten which the King has issued a second Summons to them to repair to *Golunob*, where those of the Palatinates of *Sandomir* and *Cracow* are already encamp'd. The *Muscovite* Ambassa-dor uses great Endeavours to perswade the *Polish* Grandees to the War; but we are not without hopes that Matters may be brought to a friendly Accommodation. Letters from *Lemberg* say, the *Cossacks* have committed Disorders afresh in the *Ukraine*.

*Warsaw*, July 5. The Forces of the Crown and of the Duchy of *Lithuania* being joined with the *Saxon* Troops, marched the 3d Instant from *Paltow* to *Czechonow*, where they are now encamp'd. The Ministers of *England* and *Holland* came hither yesterday from *Lublin*, in their way to the King of *Sweden's* Camp before *Theorn*. The Imperial Envoy has already sent his Secretary to know his last Resolutions in relation to the continuing of the War, or bringing Matters to an Accommodation.

*Vinna*, July 11. An Officer arriv'd here this morning from Prince *Lewis* of *Baden*, with Letters of the 6th Instant from his Quarters at *Haus-sheim*, within a Mile of the Enemy's Camp, which is so well intrenched, and so advantageously situated, with their Right Wing covered by *Dellingén*, their Left by *Linsingen*, their Rear by the *Danube*, and their Front by an Intrenchment and a Rivuler, that it is thought impossible to force it; so that all that can be done at present is to strengthen them, and to intercept their Convoys of Provisions: In the mean time Prince *Lewis* expected to be shortly joined, as well by the Margrave of *Barceith*, who was arriv'd at *Nordlingen* with the Body of Imperial Forces under his Command, as by the Troops of the King of *Prussia* and the Circle of *Westphalia*, which are coming up from the *Lower Rhine*. Lieutenant-General de la *Tour*, Governor of *Combrance*, is to have under his Command 2 or 3000 Horses, wherewith he is to make Excursions towards *Ulm*, to intercept the Enemy's Convoys, and to hinder them from receiving any Advice or Subsistence from that side. General *Heister* is to go from hence this evening towards *Tirol*, to take upon him the Command of the Imperial Forces which are gathering together in those Parts; to the number of 10000 Men. Letters from *Landes* of the 8th Instant give an Account, that the *Muskietiers*

and Country People in a Valley on the *Iler*, which leads towards that of *Engadina*, had defeated a Detachment of the *Bavarian* Forces near a Place called *Brucz*, having (as is said) killed 2000 of them, and taken the Commanding Officer with 50 private Soldiers Prisoners, besides 60 Horses, and a great quantity of Bagage. The Count de *Serini*, who has been confined near 20 years at *Rothmberg*, has, upon the Elector of *Bavaria's* Approach towards that Place, been carried from thence to the Castle of *Gratz*. The Baron of *Schenborn* is come hither with the Character of Envoy from his Uncle the Elector of *Mentz*.

*Ratisbonne*, July 16. We have not yet the Particulars of the taking of the Castle of *Ehrenberg* in *Tirol* by the *Bavarians*, though all Advices from thence agree as to its being surrendered to them; and some Letters add, that they found there a good quantity of all sorts of Provisions, which were designed for the Imperial Army in *Italy*. The Elector was on the 11th Instant with the best part of his Army still near *Inspruck*, from whence he had sent a strong Detachment to disperse the Regular Troops and Militia which are got together at *Schneeberg*, and to endeavour to open a Passage to *Brixen*: Whether the *French* will endeavour to join him with a Detachment from their Army in *Italy* is yet unknown to us, being still without Letters from *Italy*, because of the stop put to the Post from thence by the *Bavarians* being in *Tirol*. The Imperial and the *French* Armies on the *Danube* continue in the same Camps. Letters from thence of the 13th say, that Prince *Lewis* was raising several Batteries to Cannonade the Enemy in their Camp. On the 11th the *Bavarian* Town of *Wimbding* near *Donauesch* was surrendered to the Imperial General *Palfy*. On the 12th the Margrave of *Barceith*, with the Forces under his Command, broke up from *Nordlingen*, and marched to *Dillingen*, in order to join Prince *Lewis*.

*Frankfort*, July 18. We hear the *French* Army commanded by the Duke of *Burgundy* pass'd over the *Rhine* the 16th Instant at *Kehl*, but upon what Design is not yet known; The *Rhine* being much swelled by the late great Rains, has overflowed its Banks, which purther to some Inconveniency in their March, and has made Forrage very scarce. General *Teumgen*, upon notice of their Motions, has drawn to him at *Stollhoffen* the Imperial Troops which were post'd near *Philipsbourg*. He is sending a Detachment of 5000 Men to the *Kinzigers-Dale*, to prevent any Designs the Enemy may have of endeavouring to open a Communication that way with the *French* Army commanded by the Marshal de *Villars*. Our Advices from *Swabia* say, that the Margrave of *Barceith* arriv'd in Prince *Lewis* of *Baden's* Camp at *Hausheim* the 12th Instant; and that his Highness had thereupon sent a Detachment on the other side of the *Danube*, who had post'd themselves in the Valley of *Leycheim*, the more to strengthen the *French* Army. The King of *Prussia's* Forces and those of the Circle of *Westphalia* continue their March with all Diligence towards the *Upper Rhine*.

*Cologne*, July 20. Letters from the *Moselle* say all is very quiet in those Parts; and the *French* have laid aside the Preparations which they were making, upon the Jealousie they had conceived, that the Forces of *Prussia* and *Westphalia*, which are marching to the *Upper Rhine*, were designed to attack the Castle of *Traerbach*, or for some other

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
