(a) to provide for the improvement by re-aligning and re-grading of Fen Lane and Toft Hill at Sawtry in the County of Huntingdon at their junctions with the new trunk road which the Minister proposes to construct to supersede a length of the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the thirteenth day of September, 1951, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
