

the French, an advanced Party of them, consisting
of the Duke of Berwick, accompanied by Lieutenant General
Sir John de la Poer, who was one of the
best and bravest Officers of the Horse, were having

after the arrival of our Men in the very Bazaar of that
City, they seized the opportunity
to make their escape. The French
are to be seen at the Bazaar Extraordinary from
the King of Persia, and the Marquis of Saxe,
and are in full fine Chariot from the Great
Lake of Teheran, being lately brought from Eng-
land, sent by the Earl of Carlisle to his Grace before
their return home, and are now riding at break
water here. The Earl of Carlisle, accompanied
by the Duke of Berwick, several, received
orders from the King of the Persians, and was exhorting
them to make the grand Conclusion all the
Tropes, and to satisfy him, with Mon-
sieur Big and the Baron de Tasse, went from
the King to the Bazaar Extraordinary, with Monsieur Gobert,
who is a member of the Council, and to see the Bridge,
which was very much broken over the Canal, and
proposed to be repaired in a day.

On Feb^r 27 M^r T. [unclear] of Major,
from the E^t C^r, P^r [unclear], was taken his
copy of the *Journal* of the continental and
Confederate Congresses. The States of Holland
and New York were absent for some days,
during which time the principal Matters depending
before the Uⁿion. The Deputies of the several Con-
stituent Provinces, who lately came together
at Amsterdam, to form the Deputation of the States-General
of the United Provinces. There are Letters from
the Hague, etc^r, by T^r that the Elector of Saxony
had been called in Treaty a Market place, as he
was endeavoring to force a Peace; whereof we
expect the Confirmation.

Falmouth, July 19. The Spec^o of Alliance Pacquet Boat, arrived here this day from Lisbon, having been 19 days in her Passage; About 10 days ago she took a French Prize called the St. Dennis of Dunkirk, bound from that Port to the Canaries, laden with Rum, Corn, and other Commodities, found on board 10 Men and 6 Guns.

Turk's Head, July 21. About 40 Sail of Indian
Colliers came in here yesterday, and about 300
Sail more passed by at the same time to the South-
ward.

Per: Smith, July 23. Rear-Admiral Dales sailed from Spiehead yesterday to the Westward, with several of Her Majesty's Ships under his Command.

Wednesday, July 25. The Dutch Mail of the 22d instant, O. S. came in late this night, which brings Advice, that on the 21st the Grand Army commanded by his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, was joined by the French under Monseigneur Sangerhausen, and the next morning early they are marching together, and came and encamped with the Right at Buxtehude, and the Left at Glüster, from whence they would continue their March the 23d towards Lüneburg and Celle. The Letters from Germany say, the Bavarians had been repelled with Loss in several new Attempts they had made to force the Passes of the Mountain of Brenner; and that the Country Peoples in Tirol have taken from the Enemy the Castle of Schirnitz, a strong *bastion* near Innspruck, which secured their Communication with Bavaria: Some Advices add, that they have also received from the Bavarians the Castle of Rothemberg. The Imperial and the French Armies on the Danube continued in the same Camps; as did likewise the Army under the Duke of Burgundy; General Tübingen had been joined by the Forces of Westphalia.
