His day the Regency here received Advice, That the Pais of Scharmiz, where 300 Bryarian Foot were polled, has been taken by the Inhabitants of Tirol, who are in Arms for the Defence of their Country, and that the Castle of Rosh niberg is also fallen into their hands. This has cut off all Communication between us and Infornek, and an Officer who was fent from hence two days ago with a confiderable Sum of Money for our Elector, flading the Pallage stopt, returned hither; whereupon 400 boot from our Garifon, with two Field-pieces and two Mortars, have been detached that way, in order, as is fupposed, to endeavour to regain that Pass. We hear the Elector is still at In prack, where he has caused some Money to be Coined, with his own

Arms on one fide, and those of Tirol on the other.

Bases, July 25. Several Engineers, who have been ionetime in the French Arms on the first and the first and the first arms. by the Duke of Burgundy, returned yesterday to Humingen, from whence it is judged that this Army will not undertake any Siege this Campaign, and we hear that he intends to return very foon to the French Court. Letters from Languedoc fay, an Astion happened lately at Sr. Felix, near Agduse, in the securines, between the Erench King's Forces and the Camisars, wherein the former were worked; That the Malecontents took the opportunity of feveral Boats coming down the Rhofie, upon the occasion of the Fair at Beaucaire, to fend one laden with Arms and Ammunition to the Frostree, where the Inhabitants are ready to rife and join them; That the Malecontents in Country, the Inhabitants of Somieres durft keep open but one of their Gates, for fear of a Surprite, and the like Precautions were found necesto be taken in feveral other Places: And that the Murthal de Montrevel has left the Command of the French King's Forces in those Parts to Meffinites de Grandvall and Teffe, and is gone to Cata-

Raticionne, July 26. Our last Advices from the Repetit the French Armies on the Danube are Imperie' of the 2 islant; they were then still in the same C mps, and we hear Prince Lowis expects the coming up of the Forces of the King of Pral-ia and the Girels of Wifiphalia before he begins and new Enterprise. A Party of Imperial Heflars, who had for ionis days been making Excurflows in the Upper Palazinase, and railing Contri-Dragdons, and as many Foot, detached from the Davanian Garifon of Amberg, who killed 20 of them, took about the fame mamber Prifoners, and obliged the reit to retire. The Electro of Bava-ia forms refolved to push his Fortune in Tirel, and to go on with his Design of opening a Com-

munication with the French Army in Italy: He was to decamp for this purpose from Inspruck with his whole Army the 19th Instant, in order to endeavour to force the Palles of the Mountain of Brenner; and Orders were given that there should be publick Prayers at Munich for 9 days together, for a Bieffing on this Undertaking. No Letters being come from that Army or from Inferick by this-Post, we are yet without any Account from thence, whether they did march, as was intended, or what Success they may have met with: But Letters from Silvatourg of the 23d fay, they have been repulfed with Lofs from feveral Posts which they had attacked near this Mountain, and that the Elector had fent for more Forces to join him with all possible diligence. They write from Mnnich, That the Elector having left the Castle of Scharnitz, a considerable Pass on the River Ijer, not far from Inspruck, and which secured his Communication with Bavaria, under the Care of one Captain Stain:, 4000 of the Militia and Country People of Tird, part whereof were the same who lately beat the French and Bavarian Detachment near Lander, came before it, whereupon he furrendered the Place to them, for which he is brought in Chains to Numich, being suspected of holding a Correspondence with the Count dels Tour, Governor of Constance. These Disappoint-Their Disprointments may perhaps oblige the Elector of Barbaria to retire out of the Country of Tirel, without tempting his Fortune any farther.

Francfort, July 29. The Duke of Bargunly is fill encamped at tillfier; but some Deferters who are come over from him say, that on the

26th Instant he fent back his heavy Bagage to Strasbourg, and that he intends shortly to repass the Rhine: Two Regiments of Horse and a Battalion of Foot marched lately through Plakeiverg and Elm Zabers in order to join him, and s Regiments of Horse and Foot more are marched for the same purpose from Assa; yet with these Reinforcements his Army will not be much above 20000 firong, and is looked upon to be too weak for any confiderable Enterprife. Two Regiments of Dragoons marched the 17th Instant from the Imperial Lines at Stolle firm, in

order to join Prince Lewis of Bad n.
