GREENWICH HOSPITAL.

THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL (GRANT TO THE DIOCESE OF NEWCASTLE) ORDER, 1951

Made - - - - 4th October, 1951

WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 and 1943, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the Twenty-seventh day of September, 1951, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh, Lady of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, C.I., Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, C.I., His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.M.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., and Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's illness to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's

approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of August, 1951 (G.H. 434/51), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 89), it is enacted that the Admiralty, with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may make free grants of land and grants of money, for the erection of buildings and providing conveniences for places of Worship, Residence of Ministers, Education of Children, or other public purposes (so that any such grants of land do not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one Parish):

"And whereas the Lord Bishop of Newcastle has expressed his willingness, provided that a grant of five thousand four hundred pounds is made to the funds of the diocese for public purposes, such as those named in Section 30 of the said Act, thus setting free other monies under his control for augmentation of the livings, to accept transfer of the Advowsons and Rights of Presentation to the Vicarage of Alston with Garrigill, the Rectory of Bellingham, the Rectory of Falstone, the Vicarage of Humshaugh, the Rectory of Thorneyburn with Greystead, and the Rectory of Wark at present the property of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer of the said benefices to the Bishop of Newcastle on the basis proposed is in the best interests of Greenwich Hospital:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of a grant of five thousand four hundred pounds from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to the funds of the diocese of Newcastle."

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent have taken the said Memorial into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

This Order may be cited as the Greenwich Hospital (Grant to the Diocese of Newcastle) Order, 1951, and shall come into operation on the 5th day of October, 1951.
