And whereas by Section 37 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that His Majesty, if satisfied that the government of any country has acceded to the Safety Convention, may, by Order in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth are satisfied that the Government of the Republic of Haiti has acceded to the Safety Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty The Queen and Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth, being authorized thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on His Majesty's behalf order as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of the Republic of Haiti has acceded to the Safety Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) (Haiti) Order, 1951.

WHEREAS His Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts, 1937 and 1943, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the Twenty-seventh day of September, 1951, to delegate and grant unto Her Majesty The Queen, Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth Duchess of Edinburgh, Lady of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, C.I., Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, C.I., His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, K.G., K.T., K.P., G.M.B., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., and Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, C.I., G.C.V.O., G.B.E., or any two of them, as Counsellors of State, full power and authority during the period of His Majesty's illness to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of September, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, both in the diocese of Winchester, and for constituting parts of those parishes so altered together with a part of the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, in the same diocese, a new parish

" SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (i) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (ii) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the said area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony

whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and Saint John, Moordown, shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map annexed hereto.

"2. As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"3. As from the date of the consecration of a church within the said area defined in Part II of the said Schedule approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area defined in Part II of the said Schedule shall become a new parish.

"4. The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of the Holy Epiphany, Bournemouth'.

"5. The new district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Winchester and in the rural deanery of Bournemouth.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" PART I.

"The territory (shown by the green colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Francis, Bournemouth:—

"All that portion of the parish of Saint John, Moordown, which lies to the east of the middle of Haverstock Road.

" PART II.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parishes of Saint John, Moordown and Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and Saint Francis, Bournemouth (shown by the pink colour on the map), which, taken together, are bounded on the north-west by the parish of Saint Andrew, Kinson, on the north by the parish of Christchurch and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Moordown, from the parish of Christchurch in the middle of Muscliff Lane opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of the road leading from Muscliff Lane to Shelley Lodge and extending thence generally eastwards and along the middle of Muscliff Lane to a point opposite to the northeastern end of the footpath running southwestwards towards Castle Lane between closes numbered 528 and 526 and continuing thence first southwestwards, then southeastwards, and then again southwestwards along the last mentioned footpath to a point at the southwestern corner of close numbered 602 in the middle of the footpath leading to Littlecroft Avenue and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath to a point in the middle of the northeastern end of Littlecroft Avenue and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Littlecroft Avenue to the middle of Castle Lane on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, from the parish of Saint John, Moordown, and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Castle Lane (thereby following the last mentioned boundary) to a point opposite to the northeastern end of Haverstock Road and continuing thence first southwards along the middle of Haverstock Road to a point where it meets the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Moordown, from the parish of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, and continuing thence first southwards and then southwestwards along the middle of Haverstock Road to a point where it again meets the last mentioned boundary and continuing thence southwestwards along the same boundary to a point in the middle of Malvern Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Malvern Road and Redhill Crescent (thereby crossing Wimborne Road and The Avenue) to a point opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of Arden Road and continuing thence to and then along the middle of Arden Road to the southeastern end of the wall or fence on the southwestern side of the house and premises
