CHICHESTER RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Chichester Rural District Council Birdham Footpath  
No. 37 (Part) Diversion Order, 1951.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 17th day of October 1951 and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Local Government and Planning for confirmation.

The order relates to land situate in the parish of Birdham.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from north of the Tow Path of the Chichester Canal approximately 300 feet east of Salterns Lock, Birdham, in an easterly direction for a distance of 240 feet, and forming part of the footpath leading to Dell Quay to a line from north of the Town Path of the Chichester Canal approximately 520 feet east of Salterns Lock aforesaid and extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 100 feet to join the footpath leading to Dell Quay at the eastern end of the length of footpath to be stopped up.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Council Offices, Pallant House, Chichester, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Local Government and Planning, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 19th day of November, 1951, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.

DURSLEY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*The Dursley Rural District Council (Dursley  
Grammar School Path) Diversion Order, 1950.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 6th day of October, 1951, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert substantially the whole of the public right of way running from Kingshill Lane through Ordnance Survey Enclosure Number 323 and thence through the Dursley Grammar School Playing Field to Rednock Drive to a line commencing in Kingshill Lane at a point approximately 115 feet in an easterly direction from the existing public right of way and running in a southerly or south-easterly direction through Ordnance Survey Enclosure Number 323 and thence through the said Dursley Grammar School Playing Field to Rednock Drive aforesaid.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Kingshill, Dursley, Glos., and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday in each week.

The Order becomes operative as from the 20th day of October, 1951, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
