PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of *November*, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts therein mentioned, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of *Salhurst* in the diocese of *Chichester*.

“Whereas we are satisfied that *Edward Hardy*, Knight, of *Boughton Court*, *Ashford*, in the County of *Kent* is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

“And whereas the said *Edward Hardy* desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of *Chichester* for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend *George*, Bishop of *Chichester* (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said *George*, Bishop of *Chichester*, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of *Chichester* for the time being.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of *Chichester*.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th November, 1951, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th November, 1951, to Saturday, the 24th November, 1951, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TREASURY MINUTE DATED 8TH NOVEMBER,
1951 PRESCRIBING THE TERMS UPON
WHICH THE REPAYMENT OF LOANS MADE
FROM THE LOCAL LOANS FUND BEFORE
1ST AUGUST, 1945 MAY BE ALLOWED IN
ADVANCE OF THE DUE DATE.

1. My Lords have had under further consideration the terms upon which repayment of loans made to Local Authorities and others from the Local Loans Fund before 1st August, 1945 can be accepted in advance of the date at which, in accordance with the terms agreed to by the borrower at the time when the loan was made, the principal of such loans falls due for repayment.

2. Having regard to the intention of Parliament, as embodied in the Statutes governing the Fund, that the Fund should be safeguarded against loss, and to the importance of maintaining the general principle that borrowers repaying before the due date should repay an amount sufficient to liquidate the liability incurred by the Fund in respect of the advance, My Lords conclude that, in the light of prevailing monetary conditions, the provisions of Treasury Minute of 2nd January, 1948 are no longer appropriate.

3. My Lords have therefore decided that, on or after the 10th November, 1951, repayments in advance of the due date in respect of loans advanced before 1st August, 1945 may only be accepted provided:—

(i) that at least a month's notice of the intention to repay has been given to the Public Works Loan Commissioners;

(ii) that the borrower repays a sum equal to the present value of the annuity payments (or payments of equal instalments of principal with diminishing interest) still remaining to be made to the Public Works Loan Commissioners under the mortgage with those Commissioners, such present value being calculated by discounting the annuity payments (or other annual or half-yearly payments) at a rate of 3½ per cent.

4. My Lords authorise and require that unless and until They shall otherwise direct, and subject to the exceptions provided for below and in Treasury Minute of 10th December, 1947, the cash sums to be lodged in respect of the repayment in advance of loans made from the Local Loans Fund before 1st August, 1945 shall, on and after 10th November, 1951, be calculated in accordance with the terms of this Minute.

5. Should any question arise in a particular case as to the correct amount of the discounted value of the annuity (or other) repayments which it is desired to anticipate under the terms of this Minute, the matter shall be referred to the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury whose decision shall be final.

6. As an exception, repayment in respect of unexpended balances of loans already advanced will continue to be accepted (subject to due notice) on the basis of £100 for each £100 cash advanced in any case where the Public Works Loan Commissioners are satisfied that the balance is unexpended either because a scheme is less costly than was anticipated or because it has been definitely reduced in extent.

7. Treasury Minute of 2nd January, 1948 is hereby cancelled with effect from 10th November, 1951.

8. This Minute does not affect the validity of the Treasury Minute of 1st August, 1945 (regarding loans made on or after that date) which remains in force.

WAGES COUNCILS ACTS, 1945 TO 1948.

SHIRTMAKING WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Shirtmaking Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the revocation of the Shirtmaking Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1949 (Order S. (37)) and for the making of a wages regulation order relating to holidays and holiday remuneration, in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.

RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT KEEPER, FIRST CLASS, IN THE SCOTTISH RECORD OFFICE.

1. (i) Both men and women may compete under these regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 30 years of age on 1st July, 1951. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this post; in general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering any candidates for the post who are over 50 years of age.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at the time of death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's

dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. A person upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate Central Education authority (e.g. the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must possess a University degree with preferably first class honours in History (preferably including Scottish History) or in Law (preferably including Scots Law); they must also have a good knowledge of Latin and some knowledge of French; knowledge of archives administration will be an advantage.

6. Candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications and experience will be required to attend before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancy the candidate who seems most suitable. The decision of the Civil Service Commissioners will be final.

7. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons (except as referees to be named by them in their application form) will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University or otherwise.

8. The appointment of the selected candidate will be subject to his satisfying the Commissioners as to his eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until he has passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Keeper of the Records of Scotland.

9. The successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 10s. 0d. before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

(a) be serving in an established situation in the Civil Service with a certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners; or
(b) if they were rejected on medical grounds for established appointment, be serving on established conditions except for sick leave and pension; or
(c) be serving as Temporary Assistant Statisticians in the Civil Service and have had at least six months' service in the grade by that date.
3. *Sex.*
Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.
4. *Nationality.*
Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—
(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either
(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the Service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or

residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty unless he or she is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty.

5. *Examination.*

(i) There will be a written examination consisting of two papers in English, two General Papers, a paper in Statistics, and a paper in either Mathematics or Economics; at the discretion of the Commissioners candidates with good experience in statistics in post-graduate research or in University teaching may be exempted from the written examination.

(ii) Candidates who pass or are exempted from the written examination will be summoned for an interview before a Selection Board, which will recommend for appointment those who are considered to be most suitable. The Selection Board will take into consideration the results of the written examination, especially in Statistics, the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and will recommend for appointment those candidates who appear best fitted for the posts. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

6. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. *Candidates trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. *Assignment.*

The Commissioners will decide to which Government Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

9. *Canvassing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

RECRUITMENT TO THE STATISTICIAN CLASS OF THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE.

1. *Age.*
Candidates must be at least 21 and under 28 years of age on 1st November, 1951. But
(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engage-

ment in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

2. Sex.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the Service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty unless he or she is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. Examination.

7. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Government Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. A candidate who declines to accept the post offered will have no claim to be assigned to another, but will be regarded as having declined appointment. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account.

Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.
