WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of November, 1951, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Christ Church, Epsom Common; Saint Barnabas, Epsom; and Ewell, all in the diocese of Guildford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Guildford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Christ Church, Epsom Common; Saint Barnabas, Epsom; and Ewell shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"(a) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common:—

"(i) All that part of the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, which is bounded upon the southwest by the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, in the middle of Pound Lane and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of Pound Lane to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the wall or fence on the northeastern side of the house and premises known as No. 66 West Hill Avenue, and continuing thence north-westwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence to a point opposite its north-western end in the middle of the track or footpath which runs north-eastwards from West Hill Avenue to Eastway and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of the last-mentioned track or footpath to a point opposite the southeastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as No. 95 West Hill Avenue from the houses and premises known as Nos. 14 and 13 Eastway and continuing thence north-westwards first to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence and then north-eastwards along the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as No. 12 Eastway to the southeastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the house and premises known as No. 25 Manor Green Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 27 Manor Green Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 1 to 19

Hamilton Close to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common.

"(ii) All those parts of the grounds attached to the houses and premises known as Nos. 30 to 38 (even) Ridgeway which are at present within the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom.

"(iii) All that further part of the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, which is bounded on the west by the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, in the middle of Manor Green Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Manor Green Road to a point opposite the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as No. 75 Manor Green Road and continuing thence southwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common.

"(b) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom:—

"(i) All that part of the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, which is bounded upon the northeast by the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, from the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as No. 19 Hamilton Close, and continuing thence south-westwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 20 to 22 Hamilton Close and continuing thence first south-westwards and then north-westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 23 and 24 Hamilton Close and continuing thence generally northwards along the wall or fence on the north-western side of the house and premises known as No. 24 Hamilton Close and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 25 to 32 Hamilton Close to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, from the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom.

"(ii) All that further part of the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, which is bounded upon the northeast by the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, in the middle of Manor Green Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Manor Green Road to its junction with Ridgeway and Christ Church Mount, and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Christ Church Mount to a point opposite the middle of the drain or ditch at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 70 to 66 (even) Manor Green Road, and continuing thence north-eastwards first to and then along the middle of the last-mentioned drain or ditch to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, from the parish of Saint Barnabas, Epsom.

"(iii) All that part of the grounds attached to the house and premises known as No. 75 Manor Green Road, which is at present within the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common.

"(iv) All that further part of the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Chessington, upon the north by the parish of Saint Francis, Ruxley Lane, Ewell, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the parish of Saint Francis, Ruxley Lane, Ewell, the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, and the parish of Ewell meet, and continuing thence south-eastwards along the boundary which divides the parish of Ewell from the parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, to a point opposite to the middle of the northern end
