

parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme, and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme in the middle of the footpath on the south bank of the Old Canal where the said footpath crosses the Lyme Brook and extending thence southeastwards along the middle of the last-named footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme; (d) upon the southeast by the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme from the parish of Wolstanton in the middle of Hempstalls Lane and extending thence northwards along the middle of the last-mentioned lane to the middle of Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence southwestwards to the northeastern end of the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 78 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 95 Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southwestwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to the southern end of the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 76 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 78 Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 76, 74 and 72 Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence southwards along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 70 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 93 Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence eastwards along the wall or fence which divides the last-named house and premises from the open space at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 2 Beattie Avenue from the house and premises known as number 71 Hempstalls Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme.

#### "PART II

"The area comprising:—

"(a) All that portion of the parish of Wolstanton (shown by the pink colour on the map) which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Saint Mary, Knutton, upon the northwest by the parish of Chesterton, upon the northeast by the parish of Saint Andrew, Porthill, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the northwestern end of the southwestern wall or fence of the house and premises number 2 Hassam Parade and continuing thence generally southeastwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 4 to 106 Hassam Parade to Hollinshead Avenue and continuing thence southwards crossing Hollinshead Avenue to the northern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises numbered 108 to 144 Hassam Parade and continuing thence southeastwards along the last-mentioned walls or fences to Milehouse Lane and continuing thence eastwards in a straight line to the centre of the traffic roundabout in the middle of Milehouse Lane and extending thence generally southeastwards first to and then along the middle of Hoon Avenue and Hempstalls Lane to the middle of Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence southwestwards to the northeastern end of the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 78 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 95 Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southwestwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to the southern end of the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 76 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 78 Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence westwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 76, 74 and 72 Saint Michael's Road and continuing thence southwards along the wall or

fence which divides the house and premises known as number 70 Saint Michael's Road from the house and premises known as number 93 Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence eastwards along the wall or fence which divides the last named house and premises from the open space at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the western side of Hempstalls Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 2 Beattie Avenue from the house and premises known as number 71 Hempstalls Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme.

"(b) Three portions of the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme (shown by the yellow colour on the map) being:—

"(1) All that portion which is bounded upon the northwest by the parish of Wolstanton and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme where it meets the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 71 Hempstalls Lane from the house and premises known as number 2 Beattie Avenue and extending thence southeastwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence southwards to the northeastern end of the wall or fence dividing the house and premises known as number 1 Beattie Avenue from the house and premises known as number 69 Hempstalls Lane (thereby crossing Beattie Avenue) and continuing thence southwestwards firstly along the last-mentioned wall or fence and then along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 3 to 7 (odd) Beattie Avenue to its end and continuing thence in the same straight line to a point in the middle of the footpath on the western side of the Old Canal and continuing thence generally northwestwards along the middle of the last-named footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme:

"(2) All that portion which is bounded upon the west, the north, and the east by the parish of Wolstanton and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the last-named boundary in the middle of the footpath on the southwestern bank of the Old Canal where the said footpath crosses the Lyme Brook and extending thence northwestwards along the middle of the last-named footpath for a distance of 95 feet to a point opposite to the northeastern end of the wall or fence running southwestwards to the houses and premises on the northern side of Mayer Avenue and continuing thence southwestwards to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence on the eastern side of the house and premises known as number 11 Mayer Avenue and continuing thence northwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and then northwestwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the northern side of Mayer Avenue to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme:

"(3) All that portion which is bounded upon the north by the parish of Wolstanton and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the last-named boundary in the middle of Liverpool Road and extending thence southwards along the middle of Liverpool Road to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the line of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the northern side of Hassam Avenue and continuing thence northwestwards firstly to and then along the last-mentioned walls or fences to the boundary which divides the parish of Wolstanton from the parish of Saint George, Newcastle under Lyme."
