Jamaica, July 7. O. S.

HE Squadron of Her Majesty's Ships commanded by Vice-Admiral Graydon arrived here the 5th of the last Month, and sailed from hence the 23d. Brigadiev Ventris Collembine, Brigadier-General of Foot, who was on board the said Squadron, died when the Ships were in sight of this Island.

Conflaurinople, July 4. N.S. Some Disorders having lately happened on the Frontier between the Amfervire and the Tuckifb Dominions, the Grand Signior has appointed a Capigi Balhaw, named Novali Musiapha Aga, to go with the Character of his Ambaliation to the Czar, to endeavour to compose these Differences in a friendly manner: But lest his Negariation should prove unsuccessful, the Captain Bashaw is gone with the Turkish Fleet, towards the Crim Tassary, and the Turks are fortifying the Pattes of Rers and The man, to hinder the Muscovites from coming that way into the Black Sea, and have planted feveral great Guns along the Canal which leads from this City to that Sea. and on the Castle which guards the Entrance into it. The Muscowite Ambailador at Adrianople is in the mean time very narrowly observed, and hindered from having any Communication with the Christians. The Prince of Wallachia has made a christians. The Prince of Walletin has made a new Contract with the Porte, whereby he is to pay into the Grand Signior's Treasury a Yearly Tribute of 250000 Rix-Dollars, instead of 135000 which that Province paid before. The Aga of the Janisaries is made Governor of Belgrade. Sultan Mahomet; eldest Son to the Grand Signior, is dead of the Small-Pox, and was buried in the new Mosque in this City on the 7th of the 12th Month. On the 20th Signior Justiof the last Month. On the 30th Signior Justiniani, Bailo or Ambassador in Ordinary from the Republick of Venice, arrived here, to relieve Proculator Seranze: Some Ships belonging to that State attended him as far as the Island of Tonedos, and he was there received on board a Turkish Gal-; ley, which brought him hither, accompanied by

another which brought his Equipage.

Dantzick, August 15. A Fleet of Swedish Men of War and Transport Ships came last week into our Road, and have since landed near Oliva the Forces, with the Artillery and Ammunition, they had on board: They possessed themselves of the Monastery there, which they obliged to pay them 9000 Guilders by way of Contribution, and to surnish them with a great quantity of Hay and Straw, Wood for Firing, and other Necessaries. They are said to be 4000 strong, whereof 1500 are Horse, and that they are shorely to march towards Theorem, in order to join the Swedish Army before that Place. Ge-

neral Steinboch, who has been here some time, waiting the Arrival of this Convoy, has demanded of this City 100000 Crowns Contribution, and 400 Wagons for carrying their Ammunition from Oliva to their Camp before Troorn. Our Senate excused themselves from complying with his Demands; whereupon he caused the Merchant Ships in our Road to be seized, putting Soldiers on board them; but, upon the receipt of an Express from the King his Master, he has set them at siberty again, notwithstanding the Master of the Contribution demanded from this City is not yet settled.

Vienna, August 11. Monsieur Wybergh, Envoy from the King of Denmark, arrived here last week, and Monsieur Urbigh, who resided here in that Quality, is shortly to have his Audience of Leave, in order to return home. Lieutenant-General Tramp arrived here lately from Poland, and is preparing to go to Italy, to have the chief Command of the Danish Forces in that Country. The Baron of Nickard is declared Prelident of the Chamber of Silesia, in the room of the Count de Schaffgorsch, lately deceased. The Count de Schlick, being General of the Emperor's Forces in the Countries lying between the Rivers Marofeh and Tibiseus, is appointed to command the Troops which are drawing together to suppress the Rebellion in Hungary, and will accordingly, be going very foon to Segidin, which is to be the Place of their Rendezvous. The Rebels keep chiefly atheir Rendezvous. The Rebels keep chiefly about Kaco, a little Town fortified with 5 Bastions of Earth only, where Count Ragarzy and the Sieur Berzeni, the Heads of this Rebellion, are thought to be. They are faid to be about 4000 firing, but feldom appear in Parties of above 600 at a time; The most considerable Body of them that has yet been seen was that which advanced towards Great Waradin, which confifted of above 1000 Horse and Foot, who, as has been already mentioned, were most of them destroyed, being attacked on the 30th past by one Teleki, Captain of the Rassins, who, with a Body of the Militia of that Nation, mixed with some Hussars, and a few German Troops, drove them into a Morass, where very few escaped, the rest being Morals, where very few escaped, the rest being either killed or drowned, and 8 of their Standards were taken. The other Action near Bossay happened the next day, where of 500 only 200 got off, the rest being killed on the place.
