**T**HE Emperor on the 17th Instant signed a Patent for establishing a new Bank in this City, called *Banco de Giro*. Our last Accounts from *Tirol* left the French attacking *Arco*, a strong Castle on that Frontier, Garrisoned by 400 regular Troops and 200 Peasants, commanded by the Baron *de Tressen*, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of *Nigredy*, who seemed prepared for a resolute Defence. General *Heister*, who commands a Body of Imperial Forces in those Parts, intended to remove the 14th Instant from *Brixen* to *Ispruck*, to observe the Elector of *Bavaria*. The number of the Rebels in *Hungary* is increased, and it is believed they are supported by some Foreign Power, which remits considerable Sums of Money to them by the way of *Hamburg* and *Danzick*; yet it is hoped they will soon be suppressed, when once the Troops designed for that Service are got together. Letters from *Constantinople* give an Account, of Commotions begun there the 17th of July, by 250 Men only, belonging to the Artillery, who mutinied for want of their Pay; But by the 23d they were increased to vast numbers, being joined by People of all Professions, and broke out into open Rebellion; and they had sent a formal Deputation of 30 Persons to *Adrianople*, threatening the Grand Signior, to depose him, if he did not return very speedily to *Constantinople*, and immediately remove from about his Person his Mother, the Mufti, and those in their Interest. They write from *Adrianople* of the 27th, that these Remonstrances had this effect, that the Mufti, *Wizullah Effendi*, was banished, with his numerous Family, as also his Favourite the Caditcher, or Chief Judge of *Rumelia*: With these Changes they hoped the People would be satisfied, especially if the Grand Signior could be prevailed with to return to *Constantinople*, and keep his Residence there: But other Advices from *Peter-Maradin* of the 12th Instant add, that not only the Mufti, but also the Grand Vicer, *Rama Melmed Bashaw*, late *Reis Effendi*, and *Hassan Bashaw*, late Governor of *Belgrade*, are all three strangled, and the Grand Signior himself deposed, and sent to *Constantinople*; but whether dead or alive was not yet known, nor whether his Brother or Nephew shall succeed him. *Nurman Bashaw*, of the Family of *Cupertli*, and Caimacan of *Constantinople*, is said to be declared Grand Vizier, and one of his Brothers to be Mufti.

*Ratisbonne*, August 30. On the 28th Instant Colonel *Santini*, who commands the *Bavarian* Troops posted hereabouts, sent for one of our Magistrates, and told him he had Orders to demand the Keys of all our City Gates, the Arms of the Citizens, the Possession of the Magazine, and Quarters for the Soldiers who were to lie in Garrison here; and having desired the Burghers might have notice to shut their Shops, and keep within their Houses, for fear of any Disorder, he march-

ed into the Town with a Squadron of Dragoons, 3 Battalions of Foot, and 4 Field-Pieces, placed Centinels in all the Streets, and Guards in all the Market-places, and at the Gates: but having come to an Agreement with our Magistrates, whereby his Demands were in a great measure complied with, the Guards were withdrawn from the Streets and Market-places, and only left in the usual Posts. We have an Account from *Bavaria*, that on the 18th Major-General *Ravenstein*, with the Body under his Command, consisting of about 8000 Men, attacked the *Bavarian* Lines near *Passau* in 4 places, and forced them, after half an hour's Dispute, wherein he had only 3 Men killed, and 14 wounded, and the *Bavarians* 15 killed, and of their wounded 150 were brought the next day to *Sharding*, as is affirmed by Deserters: He marched afterwards to *Sherding*, and the 26th, in the morning began to bombard it, and by 10 at night they saw the Fire break out in two or three places in the Town; but upon reports that the Elector of *Bavaria* was marching with his whole Army to its Relief, the Major-General, fearing to be over-powered, retired towards *Passau*: In the mean time Colonel *d'Arnan*, whom he had sent over the *Danube* with a Detachment, had taken *Hongersberg*, a strong Castle near that River, and not far from *Deckenstorf*: Another Detachment from the Blockade of *Rothenberg* is advanced to *Amberg*; and the Hussars and Militia from *Bohmia* had summoned the Town of *Chum*, and upon the Governor's Refusal to surrender, they had laid Siege to it. The Elector, on Advice of these several Inruptions, has thought fit to abandon *Mitterwald*, and his Enterprise on *Tirol*; and having sent a Detachment towards *Scharching*, marched with the rest of his Forces to *Munich*, where he arrived the 22d, and his Troops were still encamped near that Place the 24th. General *Heister* is advanced to *Mitterwald*. Letters from the *Atmies* on the *Danube* say, that Prince *Lewis* had left the Army the 21st, contrary to all Expectation, and passed the same evening through *Gronau*, with a Guard of 150 Horse, towards *Goslingen*; his Bagage followed that night; and 15000 Men marched from the Imperial Army the next morning, with whom his Highness intended to join the Body commanded by the Count *de la Tour*, and to pass over the *Lech* into *Bavaria*: He has been reinforced near *Ebingen* by the *Dutch* Battalions under Major-General *Geor*. We hear the Duke of *Vendosmed* is still ravaging the Frontiers of *Tirol* on the Lake *de Garda*; but that the Detachment he had sent to besiege the Castle of *Arco* had been forced to retire with great Loss.

*Lindau*, August 31. The French Army commanded by the Duke of Burgundy is before *Bisfac*, and they have thrown several Bombs into the Place; but we cannot yet judge whether it will end in a Bombarding only or in a formal Siege. We hear General *Thunberg* intends to begin some Enterprise which may make a Diversion of the Enemy's Forces. Our Advices from *Swabia* say, that Prince *Lewis*, having left 57 Squadrons and 31 Battalions in his Camp at *Hausheim*, under the Command of the Count *de Surin*, to observe the Mar-
