

CATERING WAGES ACT, 1943.

UNLICENSED PLACE OF REFRESHMENT WAGES BOARD.

The Unlicensed Place of Refreshment Wages Board hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the amendment of the Wages Regulation (Unlicensed Place of Refreshment) Order, 1951 (Order U.P.R. (9)) relating to statutory minimum remuneration.

The Wages Board will consider any written representation with respect to the above mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within 21 days from 29th February, 1952. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.

CITY OF BATH.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bath (hereinafter called "the Corporation") have made application to the Minister of Housing and Local Government (hereinafter called "the Minister") for the issue of an order under sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partly to repeal, alter or amend the Bath Act, 1879 (hereinafter called "the local Act"), as amended by the Bath Order (No. 2) 1897 and the Bath Order (No. 2), 1910, so as:—

(1) in relation to the lands in the City known as Sydney Gardens to permit the Corporation, or any person to whom the Gardens have been leased by the Corporation, to close the whole or any part of the Gardens not earlier than one hour before dusk upon such days, excluding Sundays, during the months of August and September in any year as the Corporation may from time to time determine;

(2) to authorise the Corporation, or any such lessee as aforesaid, to provide in the Gardens when closed as aforesaid illuminations and musical and other entertainments and to make a charge not exceeding 2s. 6d. for each person for admission to the Gardens during such times as the entertainments are being provided; and

(3) for the several purposes of the application, or for purposes connected with, incidental to or consequent on those purposes, to make any such alteration or amendment of the said local Act, or of any other local Act, or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the City as may be necessary or desirable:
