URBAN DISTRICTS OF SPENBOROUGH AND HECKMONDWIKE.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

ON the application of the Urban District Councils of Spenborough and Heckmondwike made under Section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, Sir David Maxwell Fyfe one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by that Section did by two Orders dated respectively the 11th February 1952 and the 12th February 1952 declare Section 86 of the said Act (as to dealers in old metal and marine stores) to be in force in the Urban Districts of Spenborough and Heckmondwike.

Section 86 of the said Act requires every person who carries on business as a dealer in old metal or as a marine store dealer to register his name and place of abode and every place of business, warehouse, store and place of deposit occupied or used by him for the purpose of such business in a book to be kept for the purpose at the offices of the local authority and also to enter correctly in a book kept by him the description and price of all articles purchased by him and the name, address and occupation of the person from whom the same were purchased.

Failure to comply with these requirements renders the person carrying on such business liable to a fine not exceeding £5 and to a daily penalty not exceeding 40s.
