CARMARTHEN RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Carmarthen Rural (Spring Gardens, Whitland) Diversion Confirmation Order, 1951.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 12th day of February, 1952, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert a section of the public right of way which runs between the Railway Line to the Open Space in Spring Gardens, Whitland.

*Rural District of Nantwich No. 2 (Acton) Diversion Order, 1951.*
