NOTE.—Where the scheduled assessment for a specified injury involving multiple losses differs from the sum of the assessments for the separate injuries, the former is the appropriate assessment.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order makes further provision for retired pay and pensions for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War.
2. Articles 2, 4, 5 and 9 provide new schedules which have the effect of increasing the rates for 100 per cent. disablement by £26 a year in the case of officers and nurses and 10s. a week in the case of ratings, with proportionate increases where the degree of disablement is less than 100 per cent.
